ST. JOHN'S ACADEMY TO ADD 7TH & 8TH GRADES

The Basilica of St. James and St. John's Academy are pleased to announce that the Academy will offer middle school education beginning in the fall of 2021.

Originally a boarding school, St. John's Academy opened in 1890 and offered education through high school for 75 years until the closure of the middle and high school after the 1965-66 school year. The announcement came in mid-May, that the school will resume offering Catholic-Christian middle school education beginning in the fall of 2021 with the addition of 7th grade and with 8th grade in the fall of 2022.

A proposal was approved by the Academy's school board, the Basilica of St. James Parish Finance Council, and future pastor Rev. Neil Pfeifer.

"Adding 7th and 8th grade was a part of the vision that Monsignor Wald had for this parish and for St. John's Academy. Furthermore, it supports the mission of the Basilica of St. James and Academy," stated Rev. Pfeifer. The decision comes with encouragement and support of the Bishop of Fargo Diocese, John T. Folda, who holds a deep belief in the importance and value of Catholic-Christian education.

"I'm very pleased that St. John's Academy will add 7th and 8th grades in the next two years. This will be a great blessing for our students and their families, who already trust St. John's to pass on an excellent education and formation in the Catholic faith," stated Bishop Folda.

"Since 1890, the mission of St. John's Academy has been to educate and spiritually form the children of

this community through rigorous academics built on the firm foundation of Catholic-Christian faith. The decision to proceed with the addition of 7th and 8th grade was made with a firm belief that education within a Catholic-Christian school is both valuable and necessary for passing on the faith to the next generation. In other words, it is impossible to educate a child fully and properly without bringing Christ into the conversation," said Rev. Pfeifer.

School Principal, Jeff Trumbauer, commented "Educating middle school students here at the Academy will not only enhance the academic experience for our children but will greatly contribute to the formation and development of the whole child. The ability to present Christ to middle school children during their formative years is very important. We understand that there will be challenges to face, but through Christ all things are possible, and it is in Him we put our faith. We are excited to offer this incredible, faith-based education that has become the standard at St. John's Academy to 7th and 8th grade students. We appreciate the input and support of our stakeholders and ask for the prayers of this community as we embark on the next chapter at St. John's Academy."

2018 Building Campaign Update

The 2018 capital campaign for the addition and renovation of St. John's Academy, obtained an impressive \$5.5 million in pledges and gifts. The project was the fruit of Monsignor Jeffrey Wald's vision for the Academy. A well-known champion for Catholic education, Monsignor viewed Catholic schools as a highly effective tool for evangelization, drawing students and their families into a deeper relationship with Christ.

Following Monsignor Wald's passing, the Knight of Columbus, Council #1883, under the direction of Grand Knight, Jay Schmitz, desired to honor Monsignor Wald and the impact that he had at St. James Basilica, the Academy, and the community of Jamestown by supporting the SJA Building fund through a matching gift campaign to reduce the deficit of \$1.2 million that remained upon completion of the project at the school.

The KC's offered a matching gift opportunity of \$75,000 to the legacy of Monsignor Wald. Their generous gift was well received by the community and over a period of six weeks was matched entirely, raising over \$150,000 for the building fund of St. John's Academy.

The Knights of Columbus, Council #1883, have been tremendous supporters of the Academy through their annual giving. Their generosity has enriched the ability for St. John's Academy to offer a premier, Catholic-Christian education to all who desired to attend the school. We are grateful for the KC's continued support and for their initiative on the matching gift opportunity to honor Monsignor Wald. We pray that God will continue to bless the Knights of Columbus organization and the members of Council #1883.



ST. JOHN'S ACADEMY PERSEVERES THROUGH COVID-19 PANDEMIC



As we near the end of this school year, we reflect on what an incredible year 2020-21 has been at St. John's Academy. On March 15th we surpassed the one-year mark of living in the midst of a world-wide pandemic. Last year, we made the swift transition to providing online education through virtual classrooms. Within a matter of days, the Academy team of teachers and staff implemented the platform for providing "Distance Learning" to all preschool through 6th grade students, a feat that had not been attempted previously in the school's history.

In conjunction with the pandemic, the Academy continued, throughout the spring and summer, the construction and renovation project for the 2020 addition. School personnel worked tirelessly to ensure that in-person instruction would resume in the fall and that the students would be able to begin the 2020-21 school year in the new and renovated school building.

There was a great deal of thought and consideration given to what steps could be taken to ensure that our building would be safe, and that face-to-face instruction could take place throughout the school year. A proposal was made to the Basilica of St. James Parish Finance Council to add additional staff to reduce class sizes, enhance social distancing measures, and to provide internal flexibility to trouble shoot potential issues that may develop due to COVID-19. The proposal for an additional budgetary expenditure of \$130,000 for an increase in staff was approved and resulted in adding four new staff members to the St. John's Academy team. We are very grateful for the Basilica's continued support of the Academy and their belief in the importance of fulfilling our mission at St. John's Academy.

The staff deserves a world of praise for their hard work and determination to master several new learning system trainings and preparing their

classrooms just days before the students were to return. With the new addition of the virtual classroom platform, students had the ability to continue their work from home, if and when the need arose to quarantine for any amount of time. These new platforms and strategies required the teachers to simultaneously provide two learning experiences, teaching students both in-person and virtually on any given day and at times for long stretches of the school year. "This year, our students have grown in compassion, insight, and problem-solving skills," 4th grade teacher, Mrs. Gapinski said. "I witness them finding new and different ways to use our ever-growing technological literacy. We have especially grown in trusting God's plan and not our own."

Looking back at what was understood in March 2020, we did not know what the future would hold. There were more questions than answers. As has been true throughout the history of St. John's Academy, character was revealed in the face of adversity. As we close this chapter, we reflect on what was learned and was lost through the passing of our beloved Monsignor Wald. While his death was a great loss to St. James Basilica, St. John's Academy, and the community of Jamestown, we hope that he would be proud of our determination and perseverance through the many challenges brought on by the pandemic.

Looking forward, we rejoice in the challenges that have come our way because we know that it is only through Christ Jesus that we have overcome. St. John's Academy exists for the glory of God. We continue to praise Him from Whom all blessings flow. We look forward to how God will continue to grow St. John's Academy in years to come.

Giving Hearts Day Sets New Record



Giving Hearts Day is a 24-hour giving event for the North Dakota/Minnesota region. All funds raised on GHD support St. John's Academy's Annual Fund, which is the lifeblood of our beloved school, supporting everything from rigorous curriculum to lowered tuition rates.

Heading into the new year, we were uncertain of what Giving Hearts Day would look like at St. John's Academy. Although the pandemic was starting to lose momentum by February, our state was still under capacity limitations for large groups. Sadly, this meant we were not able to host a dinner or fellowship of any kind, like we have traditionally done in the past. Fortunately, we were able to use technology to connect with friends of the Academy virtually via Facebook live. We hosted interviews with teachers, school board members, parents, and were able to show off some of the new building addition.

An ambitious goal was set at \$60,000 for the 24-hour day of giving. A generous match gift of \$20,000 from Dr. Tom & Joyce Rulon was a tremendous boost to the event, generating further incentive to support the Academy! The Rulon's love for Catholic education and experience with St. John's Academy has been a continuous reason for their support of the school. Words cannot adequately express our appreciation for their support, which has had an incredible impact on the Academy and has helped transform SJA into a premiere educational experience for our students.

Additionally, the Knights of Columbus, Council 1883, gave a generous match gift of \$10,000! How fortunate this school is to receive not one, but two

matching gifts totaling \$30,000. The Knights of Columbus have been tremendously supportive over the years and we are grateful for their big giving heart for Catholic Education!

Of course, we would not have reached our goal if it had not been for the hundreds of other donations St. John's Academy received on February 11th. We were blown away by the support from donors across the country. Not only was the goal met, but it was exceeded, breaking the record for funds raised on Giving Hearts Day with a total of just over \$76,000!! Wow! 
Fr. Neil Pfeifer

Fr. Pfeifer comes to us from St. Philip Neri Catholic Church in Napoleon, ND, where he has served since 2016.

Fr. Neil Pfeifer was born and raised on a small grain farm southwest of Rugby, ND. After high school graduation, Fr. Pfeifer attended the University of Mary in Bismarck for 3 semesters and came back to the family farm for 8 years working alongside of his family. He was actively involved in Little Flower Parish and helped start a parish youth group as a Youth Director, where his call to the priesthood came to life.

He entered Cardinal Muench Seminary in Fargo and took classes on the campus of North Dakota State University, the fall of 2004, graduating in 2007. Fr. Pfeifer completed his studies at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD with a Master's Degree in Theology in 2011. Father was ordained a Priest for the Diocese of Fargo at St. Mary's Cathedral in Fargo, North Dakota on July 1, 2011.

Since then, Fr. Pfeifer has served at St. Michael's Catholic Church, Grand Forks, from 2011-2014. From 2014-2016 he served Holy Spirit Catholic Church and School in Fargo, as well as teaching at Shanley High School and Sullivan Middle School in Fargo as part of his assignment.



From 2016-2021 he lived in Napoleon serving St. Philip Neri.

Fr. Pfeifer's passion for the youth is well known with his work in the schools and in the parishes. He believes in the youth as the future of the church.

Principal Jeff Trumbauer commented, "We are very excited to have Fr. Pfeifer assigned to Jamestown. He is extremely energetic, passionate, and committed to Catholic education. His previous assignments gave him




