Some of you may know I, as part of my work at Bishop Ryan, coordinate our annual pilgrimage to the national March for Life in Washington, DC and to say that the devil was working against us these past two

us to supplement what we collect from the pilgrims and pay for our bus, hotel rooms, and any numerous miscellaneous items that come up throughout this pilgrimage so that we may march with hundreds of thousands of other pro-life pilgrims from across the country in an effort to finally end the intrinsic evil we know as abortion.

Know that the Knights' contribution in this fight goes beyond treasure as every year I get to meet Knights who help at the Basilica coordinating Masses for pilgrims coming into town, feed us on the way to DC, and are very, very visible on the day of the march doing whatever is asked of them by the March committee. Be proud, we are taking a front-line stance in the fight against the culture of death and it is so awe inspiring to see our Brother Knights, many times three generations standing together, being so active in the fight.


