The City Wide Eucharistic Procession Committee has requested the Assembly to participate in the Eucharistic Procession on June 6th, Corpus Christi Sunday. The Procession will begin at 2:00pm at Our Lady of Grace with Mass and will finish at St John's at about 5:00pm. The Committee has requested ten Sir Knights, in uniform, to participate in the following ways: 4 Sir Knight as the Color Corps to lead the Procession, 4 Sir Knights to carry the canopy to cover the priests and monstrance, and 2 Sir Knights to be Honor Guard for the priests and monstrance. Assistance from all available Sir Knights will be greatly appreciated.




