Brother Knights,

I'm going to deviate a bit from maybe a normal message to talk for a moment on a struggle that many of our councils are going through today.

While many of the councils in our district have done well and are recruiting new members I'm seeing a struggle to follow up with that recruit-

ment in members participation in our charitable works.

We know that the Knights are an organization that gives generously and frequently to many charitable organizations, many having a direct connection to our Church. These monies do not just appear because we want to write a check, but rather come about through many of our public, and private works of charity. Arguably the most well-known would be our breakfasts that we run from fall until spring. These are not easy undertakings, often involving hours of prep of the food, advertising, and calling for help for each month's breakfast. From these breakfasts and our efforts however, the vast majority of our monies that we give is received and are of the utmost importance to our future donations.

Here is where we must take a hard look in the mirror and ask ourselves, "What can I do to help?" For the most part many of our

council breakfasts rely on the same few men to work each, and often every, month. When we became Knights, we took on the responsibility of being there for our Church's needs, I'm asking my brother Knights to now step forward, not wait to be asked, but to say "What can I do to help?"

More and more there is a need in Minot for charitable works. The soup kitchen at St. Leo's is serving 160+ people a week, the food pantry at Our Lady of Grace would not be expanding if there wasn't a need for it, and everybody's resources are stretched thin. I understand that giving some of the valuable few hours that we have on the weekends is a sacrifice, but if we want to continue our works and give to what is needed, we need to step up now and help each other reach this goal. Every council is large enough that if half of our members worked one breakfast we would have every breakfast covered between now and next Spring. I beg of you to prayerfully discern what you can do to help and reach out to your Grand Knight asking where the help is needed most.

Once again, thank you for all that you do, as long as the Church has a need, the Knights will be there.


