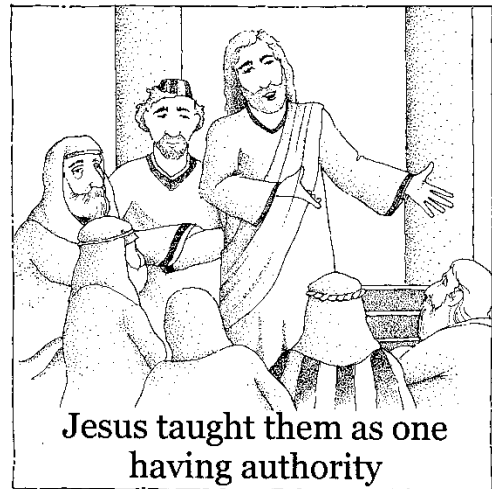

**Next Week's Gospel: Mark 1:21-28**

**Gospel Reflection:** Mark describes for us how Jesus' day begins and ends with taking care of others. He heals Simon's mother-in-law, cures others who are sick, drives out demons from those who are possessed, and comforts the downhearted and discouraged. The crowds follow Him wherever He goes. Even when He goes off to a lonely place to pray and be renewed, Jesus is tracked down by His disciples who say, "Everybody is looking for you!" Without complaint, Jesus responds at once by heading for the nearby villages to heal, preach, and comfort.

**Discussion Points for Gospel:** When you hear about people who are sick, lonely, or discouraged, what do you do? How do you think this Gospel story might inspire you to be more like Jesus?

Your adopted baby is now 2 months old! Lungs are formed, muscles are working, reflexes are present, and baby can move. Baby has become sensitive and responds to touch. He will even grab an instrument placed in his palm and hold on! Ears and eyelids are forming. All four major areas of the adult brain are present and brain waves can be recorded. All systems are 'go': skeletal, nervous, digestive, circulatory, and respiratory. At this point baby's gender can be identified, and the lines that will be in his palms and on his feet are present.
