FEBRUARY 11, 2024 | SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear parishioners of our Blessed Mother,

In this weekend's gospel a leper approaches Jesus and begs Him, "if He so wishes," to heal him of his leprosy. Such an affliction as leprosy would have not only been painful physically but also emotionally, psychologically, and spiritually as well. For such "uncleanliness" would require an individual to be cast outside the camp, thus rendering one incapable of worshipping God in the Temple as well depriving him of any form of community so integrally woven into the daily life of the Jews (something that technology has also "outcasted" modern man from to some degree I might argue, but that's an aside).

Jesus, as fully God, does indeed "wish" and choose to do so, but only after the fullness of His humanity is also displayed. Mark illustrates Jesus' compassion in being "moved with pity" for this leprous man in his multi-dimensional poverty. In a gesture of compassion that nobody would have dared to do, Jesus "stretched out His hand, touched him," and made Him clean. Jesus is the only One who could fill the void of his poverty, for if any other were to touch the leper, the uncleanness of physical, social, and liturgical expulsion would have "infected" that person as well. In a divine turn of events, however, physical contact with Purity and Holiness Himself restores one's dignity and status in liturgical and social involvement.

Why though, after having been made clean, did the leper still have to "show himself to the priests and offer for his cleansing what Moses prescribed?" Jesus connects His life, giving and communal restoration, to liturgical action. For what Moses prescribed in the Levitical Law (Lev. 14:3-7) involved taking two birds, slaughtering one, covering the other with its blood, and setting that other living bird free. In this liturgical action, one is to see the Blood of Jesus setting free those who participate in His Body and are covered in His Blood – the Eucharistic celebration.

Having such physical contact with Purity and Holiness Himself at Mass, we poor outcasts who suffer from all kinds of spiritual leprosy are made clean/holy. Not only does this liturgical action restore and unite us socially as members of the same Body, but it also restores us to right worship of God since the holy Mass is itself Jesus' perfect prayer of self-sacrificial gift to the Father.

May our Blessed Mother draw us deeper into this healing mystery.


Charismatic Prayer Group will meet on Monday, Feb. 12 at 7:00 PM in the main church. Prayers for healing will follow at 8:00 PM.

KC Breakfast - St. John - February 18

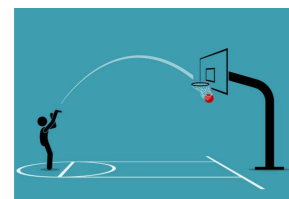

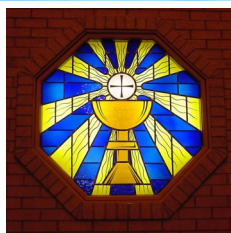

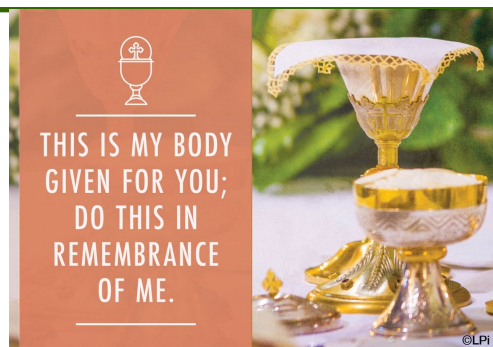


If you witnessed a miracle, wouldn't you want to tell everyone? If you saw the sun dance in the sky, a crippled man walk, or the Virgin Mary appear in front of you, wouldn't you just want to shout about it from a rooftop so all could hear? Maybe you would be afraid others would not believe you. You might choose instead to keep it to yourself to avoid criticism and ridicule. At least, if you saw a miracle, you would have a choice: to tell or not to tell.

Yet, at every Mass we witness a miracle. We witness bread and wine as it becomes the true presence of Jesus Christ. It isn't a saint or Mary appearing before us; it is actually Jesus! When was the last time you told anybody about that miracle? It might not be easy for us to always talk about our faith, but we can show them. When we receive the Eucharist into our bodies, we become one with

Christ. We go forth from the Mass as a living testimony of the miracle that occurred at Mass.

People will not be able to simply look at us and see the evidence. We need to demonstrate to them the reality of this miracle by our good deeds and profound acts of charity. That is stewardship. That is bearing witness to the truth of our God being truly present to us. It is something we should want to share with everyone. --Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS
