FEBRUARY 18, 2024 | FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear parishioners,

On June 6th, 1944, the Allies landed roughly 150,000 troops in northern France, and after about forty days or so, they numbered about one million. With this Allied army in the west and the Soviets pressing from the east, the war against the vastly outnumbered German Reich was over “in principle.” However, it still took almost a year in order for the German High Command to surrender and bring the war’s end to final fulfillment.

On this 1st Sunday of Lent, 2024, we hear how the Holy Spirit drove Jesus from the place of His baptism in the Jordan out into the desert for forty days where he engaged in combat with the “wild beasts” of Satan and his army. Having launched His invasion from the banks of the Jordan River, the victory is won “in principle,” and Jesus victoriously exclaims after His desert combat, “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel.”

In His very Person, Jesus recapitulates (meaning sums up and fulfills) the entire Old Testament story of Israel, who wandered forty years in the desert after crossing the Red Sea and before the triumphal entry into the Promised Land. During this time of Israel’s temptation in the desert, the Lord tested His people with periods of hunger and humility; yet He also faithfully fed them with mysterious bread from heaven (“manna”) to teach them that “man does not live by bread alone, but by everything that proceeds from the mouth of God” (Dt. 8:3; Lk 4:4).

Now with the entirety of the Old Testament summed up in Jesus, and His invasion having been launched from the waters of the Jordan River, the time of fulfillment has indeed arrived. However, His victorious kingdom has yet to expand and grow into the dark valleys and treacherous mountain regions of our hearts. Just like the many battles that had to be fought after June 6th, 1944, so too does Christ do battle against the “wild beasts” that tempt His people today. Among His arsenal that He uses to expand His kingdom are the practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This is one of the reasons why Holy Mother Church has us engage in such practices during Lent, so that through this preparatory period in our own wilderness journey, we might participate more fully at the triumphal victory of Jesus’ Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

A blessed Lent to you all.

Old Palms and other Blessed Sacramentals

A sacramental — blessed and recognized by the church as an aid to receiving grace — **should be disposed of with honor and respect.** Burning a blessed object so that it no longer exists intact, or returning it to the earth via burial, are both intrinsically more reverent acts than simply adding a sacramental to the trash.

If you cannot or prefer not to burn or bury your old palm branches, you are welcome to **bring them to the Our Lady of Grace office.** Fr. Maus will properly dispose of them. You may also bring other sacramentals — old rosaries, scapulars, bibles, and other blessed items that you no longer use.

The Stations of the Cross began as the practice of pious pilgrims to Jerusalem who would retrace the final journey of Jesus Christ to Calvary.

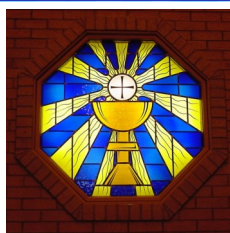
