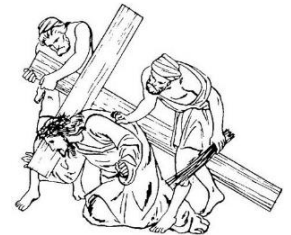

WHAT'S HAPPENING DURING LENT?

Lenten Regulations: Friday's during Lent are required abstinence for all Catholics. Abstinence means abstaining from all meats and meat products.

Daily Mass: There is no better Lenten exercise than to attend daily Mass. Our parish has Mass every weekday: Monday-7:15 am; Tuesday-7:00 pm; Wednesday, 9:00 am; Thursday and Friday-7:15 am and 9:00 am. A Communion Service is held on Monday at 9:00 AM.

Stations of the Cross: We will have the stations conducted in our church every Friday during Lent at 5:30 pm. The Living Stations will take place at 7:00 pm on Sunday, March 28. All are welcome!

Next Week's Gospel: Mark 15:1-39
Palm Sunday – March 28, 2021

Gospel Reflection

This Palm Sunday reading of the Passion of the Lord is taken from Mark's Gospel. It was the first written account of how Jesus suffered and died. It is also the shortest version of the Passion and is written almost like a newspaper story that presents "just the facts."

The most important truth Mark wants to communicate is that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, whose suffering leads to glory. When Jesus cries out from the Cross, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (see Psalm 22:1), he is praying in the words of the psalmist who continued to trust God even when all seemed hopeless.

As we read or listen to the Passion, we try to unite ourselves with Jesus and all those who suffer injustice in today's world.

Discussion Questions for Gospel

Imagine that you are one of the following people: Pilate, Barabbas, a Roman soldier, Simon of Cyrene, a member of the crowd, or the centurion. Describe your thoughts and feelings about Jesus as he endures his Passion and Crucifixion. Why do you think people sometimes ridicule and mock others? What does the example of Jesus teach us about seeking revenge against others?

Why do you think people in crowds sometimes act in ways they would never act as individuals? What insights into human behavior does the Passion of Jesus give you? How will you show this week that you honor Jesus as the Messiah and Son of God?

Specified area for mask-only seating during Mass
