Ticket prices have been set at \$35 per person and \$80 for a family that includes children age 16 and under. **Tickets available at Our Lady of Grace Parish Office.**



If you are new to our parish and are wondering about **sacraments** for your child, at Our Lady of Grace the children prepare for and receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation (confession) and First Eucharist (communion) during their 2nd grade year in school. Each year we typically have older children in the program, as well. Please contact the Faith Formation office if you have an older child who needs to receive the sacraments. Sacramental preparation is required for all children, including those who attend Catholic school. For the sacrament of Confirmation, students attend classes in 9th grade and are confirmed by the bishop in the fall of 10th grade. Older students who have not received the sacrament are also invited to participate in the Confirmation program. Preparation for Confirmation is required for all who wish to receive the sacrament, including those who attend Catholic school.



Registration forms for sacramental preparation and for all Faith Formation classes for preschool through grade 9, as well as for our middle school and high school youth groups, will be mailed in early August to all families who are registered members of the church and have children in these age groups.

City-wide**CORPUS CHRISTI EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION**

A city-wide Eucharistic Procession will be held (weather permitting) on **Sunday, June 6** – The Feast of Corpus Christi (Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ). This **family-friendly event** is open to the public.

The event will begin with a **2PM Mass at Our Lady of Grace Church**. At approximately **3PM** we will process from **Our Lady of Grace to St. Leo the Great Catholic Church**, then to **St. Therese Church of the Little Flower** and then to **St. John the Apostle Catholic Church** where we will end with **Benediction**. You are welcome to join anywhere along the route, and there will be bus transportation available back to your vehicles.

Designed to help bring peace, prayer, and healing to our nation through the Eucharistic Presence of our Lord Jesus Christ, this event is being planned by local parishioners. Clergy will lead the procession, and everyone is invited to pray as we process.

For those not able to walk in the procession, Eucharistic Adoration with a Rosary for all fifty states will be held at each parish during the procession. Approximate times will be posted at each parish. Our Lady of Grace for one hour following Mass for Rosary for 50 states.

Attention families! All kids who have received their First Communion up through 5th grade are invited to **lead this year's Eucharistic Procession** by throwing flower petals in front of our Eucharistic Lord! If you received Jesus for the first time this year we ask you to wear your **First Holy Communion dress or suit**. For the other children, we ask **girls to wear white** and **boys to wear black** if possible. (with comfortable shoes of any color) Parents, if your children are interested, you and your children can join this Holy Procession at 3 of Minot's 4 Catholic churches. (St John's is at the end of the Procession so kids from St John's would need to join in at one of the other churches.) **Please call one of the 3 contact people listed below to let them know where you plan to join in.** If your family can not process all the way to St John's, buses will be available to take you back to your car at each church. It's approximately 1.7 miles between each church. (please see the complete Eucharistic Procession announcement for more info.) Maybe your family can make it the whole way! (wagons and strollers are welcomed) Even though the roses are limited, each child who participates will get to be up front for at least one leg of the Procession. (all flowers with pedals are welcomed if you want to bring more).
