Hello everyone,

Writing to you for the first time. I am doing so from SonShine Youth Camp, and we are having a wonderful time. This year the theme is "Spiritual Bootcamp". The campers are receiving education and spiritual tools to help them in the very real spiritual battle that we all face in this life. This is a good lesson for all of us, and I will share some highlights that can help us all.

Since we are beloved children of God, created out of love, by love Himself, in His image, we are meant to participate in that love, both in this life and the next. We are made for spending eternity with God our creator in heaven, our ultimate goal, and the evil one is relentlessly trying to keep this from happening. From small subtle ways to extremely obvious ways, we are tempted to choose things of the world/sin that will ultimately end in lack of satisfaction and discord in the soul (spiritual death) over the good things of God himself and holiness that always satisfy, bring peace, and bear the fruits of the Holy Spirit (life with God). So, what can we do to make sure we are recognizing what is going on and deal rightly with it?

We can employ the words of St. Paul to the Ephesians (one of the great passages the teachers used at camp this year): *"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we are not contending against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this present darkness, against the spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore, take the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having fastened the belt of truth around your waist, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the equipment of the gospel of peace; besides all these, taking the shield of faith, with which you can quench all the flaming darts of the Evil One. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. Pray at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication. To that end keep alert with all perseverance, making supplication for all the saints. (Eph. 6:10-18)".*

Prayer, living a Sacramental life and being faithful to God and His Church, intentionally making sacrifices for the good of others to overcome selfishness, and asking for help when needed is putting on the armor of God. Facing temptations with the faith and Truth of the Gospel, God's Word, is putting on armor, and we are never left alone. God is always and forever present to us and desires to aid us in the battle of carrying our crosses in life. Let us always act in faith, knowing and trusting that our gracious and loving God will give all the grace needed to choose Him over any temptation if we ask for it. Let us implore the help of the Saints who fought the battle with Jesus before us, and won.

Please say a special prayer for the poor and forgotten, and for those who serve them through the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

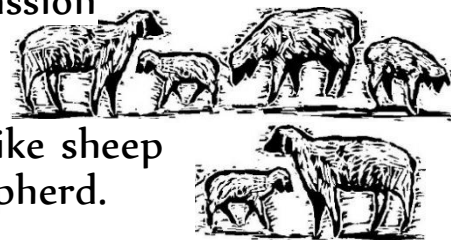

Gospel Reflection

When large crowds gather, exciting and unexpected things can happen. That's the way it was when Jesus went up on a mountain shortly before the Passover feast. A crowd of five thousand soon gathered around him. They were determined to hear him speak and to see what great signs he might work. Unlike his disciples, Jesus was not concerned about how this huge crowd was to be fed on a few loaves and fishes.

In actions that are now familiar to us, Jesus took the bread, broke it, blessed it and gave it to the people. When the crowd realized that everyone had been fed and there were still leftovers, they were astounded. They wanted to carry Jesus off on their shoulders and make him their king.

Discussion Questions for Gospel

Look back at the Gospel account. How does it encourage you to act when you feel that you have little to offer to those in need?
