Greetings everyone,

Maybe it has been on your heart too, as it is on mine, the question of how do we get people back to living a Sacramental life in the Church? Yes, it is summertime, but there are a lot of empty pews.

As part of your daily prayer, ask God the Holy Spirit to help you be aware of the particular graces that He gives you, and to know how to share what you receive from Him with others. Then, do not be afraid to act on the promptings of the Holy Spirit when engaging those who are not living in right relationship with God. Tell them all about what God does in you and for you.

Sunday evening 5:30 PM Mass and additional Spanish Masses to be offered

On July 25, our parish will begin offering a **5:30 P.M. Sunday Mass** each week, in addition to our regular Masses of 4:00 p.m. Saturday and 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Sunday.

Beginning in September, the Confirmation classes and High School Youth Group activities will take place on Sunday evenings after the 5:30 p.m. Mass. We are hopeful that high school students, and especially those in Confirmation classes, will participate in the ministries of the 5:30 p.m. Mass, such as reading, ushering, greeting, providing the music, carrying the offertory gifts, and serving as altar servers.

Our Lady of Grace currently offers **Spanish-language Mass** once per month. Beginning in August, Spanish-language Mass will be held twice per month. The Masses (starting August 15) will be at **1:00 p.m.** on the first and third Sundays of each month.

These additions to our Mass schedule will require involvement by more volunteers. To volunteer, please contact Deacon Steve Streitz at 839-6834 or sign up on the volunteer sheets posted throughout the church.

Mass Intentions:



Prayer and Reflection

Next Week's Gospel: John 6:24-35

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time – August 1, 2021

Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus does what he often did as he taught people. He moves them to ever deeper levels of understanding. They had eaten the loaves that Jesus had miraculously multiplied. Now Jesus invites them to consider the "food that endures for eternal life." Finally, Jesus tells them, "I am the bread of life." This bread, then, is the bread they need in order to be able to "accomplish the works of God." We can move to deeper understanding with Jesus too. Consider the food we eat and how, ultimately, every morsel is a gift from God. As food nourishes our bodies for our life and work, so the Bread of Life strengthens us to do God's work.

Discussion Questions for Gospel

The people in today's Gospel took boats so that they could seek Jesus. What do you do to seek Jesus in your life?

How does the Bread of Life, Jesus, satisfy your hungers?
