## Faith Formation

**It's time to register!** We are excited to welcome your children and grandchildren (age 3 through high school) to our Faith Formation and Youth programs this school year! An online registration form may be found on the Faith Formation page of our website: [olgminot.org](http://olgminot.org). Registration forms were also mailed and are available on the bulletin board in the classroom hallway.

**Please volunteer** to assist in some way with our Faith Formation and Youth Group programs. Many of our past volunteers did not have children in the classes but wanted to help the children and youth of our parish. We have a volunteer form on the classroom hallway bulletin board, as well as online on the Faith Formation page of our website. Each year we have about 250 or more children participating; so a large number of volunteers is needed. Those who volunteer on a consistent basis may receive free tuition for their children or grandchildren.

### **Special registration note for Bishop Ryan Catholic School families:**

If your child is in grade 2 or higher and has not received the sacraments of **First Reconciliation** (confession) and **First Eucharist** (communion), please register only on the "Sacramental Preparation" part of the registration form. Your children will attend retreats, rehearsal, etc., and do some work at home to prepare for the sacraments, but they do not need to attend Faith Formation classes. There is no fee for Sacramental Preparation. If your child is in grade 9 or higher and has not received the sacrament of Confirmation, please register for "**Confirmation**" on the Faith Formation form, but indicate that you are a Bishop Ryan family. Bishop Ryan students have limited requirements for Confirmation. They are required to attend the Sept. 12 Orientation (or Sept. 14 Make-up Orientation) with their parents, and to attend follow-up meetings in Fall 2022, as well as complete service hours and other requirements; however they are not required to attend the classes since they receive religious instruction at Bishop Ryan. The requirements for service hours, saint names, Confirmation sponsors, etc., will be explained at Orientation. Bishop Ryan families are not required to pay the \$50 tuition for Confirmation, since the students will not receive classroom materials.

**Class and Youth Group Calendars** may be found on the Faith Formation page of our website, and on the classroom hallway bulletin board

**Some changes to Faith Formation classes** this year include:

- Preschoolers (ages 3-5) may attend class on Sundays from 9:20-10:20AM, together with children in Kindergarten through grade 5.
- Ten minutes have been added to the Wednesday gr. K-5 classes, allowing for more opportunities to learn, practice prayers, and participate in Eucharistic Adoration and other faith-building efforts. The Wednesday gr. K-5 classes will be from 4:00-5:10PM and from 5:30-6:40PM.
- With the addition of the 5:30PM Mass on Sundays, we have moved Confirmation classes and High School Youth Group to Sunday evenings.
- Every grade level will have the opportunity to participate in Eucharistic Adoration as part of their Faith Formation program. We need adult volunteers to be present with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament during Faith Formation transition times, etc., on particular Wednesdays. Please contact us to volunteer.



**High School and Middle School Youth Groups!** Students are not required to register for High School or Middle School Youth Group to attend the events, but your registration makes it easier for us to plan and to contact you with details. High School Youth Group will be held about seven Sunday evenings (6:30-8:00PM, after the 5:30PM Mass) during the school year. Middle School Youth Group will be held about seven Wednesday evenings (7:00-8:30PM) during the school year. Other Youth Group dates may be added.

**Confirmation Orientation for students and parents:** The required Orientation meeting for parents and students who wish to receive the sacrament of Confirmation at Our Lady of Grace is Sunday, Sept. 12, following the 5:30PM Mass. There will be a simple meal at 6:30PM; then the Orientation meeting from 7:00-8:00PM. If you are unable to attend, the Make-up Orientation with a simple meal is from 5:30-6:50PM on Tuesday, Sept. 14 (before the 7:00PM Mass).

**2nd-year Confirmation students:** You have class on Wednesday, Sept. 1, from 7:00-8:30PM in the dining room to continue your preparation for the Oct. 10 2:00 PM Confirmation Mass with Bishop Kagan.

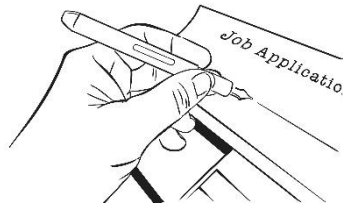

**Prayer and Reflection**

**Next Week's Gospel: John 6:60-69**  
**21st Sunday in Ordinary Time – August 22, 2021**

**Gospel Reflection**

What a sad day it would be if some of our friends suddenly turned against us because of our religious beliefs. Today's Gospel reading relates that many of Jesus' disciples left him. They could not accept his teaching that he himself was the Bread of Life. They could not believe that his Body and Blood were the source of eternal life. So they turned their backs on him and returned to their old way of life.

However, when Jesus asked the Twelve if they too would abandon him, Peter replied, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." We too at times may find some of Jesus' teachings difficult. When that happens, we should speak to him honestly in prayer and seek his help.

**Discussion Questions for Gospel**

What disagreements, if any, about religious beliefs, have you ever had with your friends? Why is it sometimes difficult to practice our religious beliefs when others do not share them? How would you describe the way Jesus responds to the disciples who turn away from him? How does he show the importance of his teaching on the Eucharist?

What teachings of Jesus have you had difficulties with at times? Who or what helped you to work out those difficulties? How would you describe Peter's answer to Jesus' question about leaving him? Name one way people your age can show the kind of faith in Jesus expressed by Peter.
