Ordinary Time. Along with the Sanctus and Agnus
Dei we currently sing, this Kyrie was included in
Pope St. Paul VI’s 1974 publication *Jubilate Deo*, a
collection of chants he proposed as a minimum
repertoire for the universal Church in hopes that it
may help Christians to “achieve unity and spiritual
harmony with their brothers and with the living
traditions of the past” (*Voluntati Obsequens*).
