Message from the Grand Knight

We had a great exemplification on February 4th bringing two new members into our Council - Todd Rainey and Alex Moening. Brother Doug Moening and his son Daniel made their 2nd and 3rd degrees. We need just 5 more members to reach Star Council; it is attainable! We had a fantastic Pancake Breakfast on the 19th of February. Thank you for all that showed up and worked on it again.

Some great things came up at the district meeting that needs to be brought to light. Out of the 9 local area Knight councils, we are doing well as a Council, very well! I have heard so much negativity about our Council over the last several years which is false in every way shape and form. I am here to give the hard cold facts that cannot be disputed.

- 1. Our Financials are very good with over \$100K is assets.
- 2. We have 6 new members this year. We've had no new members over the last several years. Let's keep going...
- 3. Out of 9 local councils we have the highest percentage of families that are Knights. When you get to 10% that is considered good; we are at 20% which is AWESOME.
- 4. We have the 2nd highest numbers of Knights in our council. St Pat's who is number one only has 8.9% to the amount of families in the parish.
- 5. Out of the 9 local councils both District Deputies said that they are lucky to get 10-15 members per meetings. We on average have 40-45 per meeting.
- 6. We received the Columbian award last year under Joe Cylkowski's Leadership.
- 7. We have you in our Council.

All of this information can be found in our meeting minutes and the chart on the next page that was put together by the State of Michigan Knights of Columbus.

What we need is for more of you to get involved with the things we do. Our biggest problem is people are getting burnt out. I want you younger Knights (below 50 years of age) to start coming to the meetings and take charge.

We will have election nominations starting in April and I want new blood in the officers' positions. For example, Tony Young is currently Deputy Grand Knight and soon will be our Grand Knight. He is the type of young blood we need for the continued success of our council. Bill Dillon has been Treasurer for quite a long time (as well as Newsletter editor and parliamentarian) and will be stepping down at the end of this term, so we need someone with financial background to fill that hole. Dennis Nunnold is moving on with a new chapter in his life so we will also need a new Financial Secretary. Please contact me if you would be interested in being the Financial Secretary as it's an appointed position by the Grand Knight.

We have many great things that we have been doing as a Council and will continue to build on them. I also want to put in a plug for *Hartland Brewery*. Brother Ryan MacDonald who owns it is going to donate a portion of all sales on March 19th to our Council. Please come anytime that day and support them and our Council by going for some good food and great cold beverages. I look forward to seeing everyone soon.



Subject: Medical Assistance

Passing along some information that those who usher at church may find helpful. In fact, this is information that all of us could use at church or at home. Included is a series of You Tube videos developed by The American Red Cross. Google the following headings below to watch:

- YouTube video "Using an AED machine" about 4 minutes in length.
- YouTube video "Using an AED/CPR in Progress" 1 minute 17 seconds.
- YouTube video "How to Recognize the Signs of a Stroke" about a half minute.
- YouTube video "How to Administer CPR (as an individual/two-person team).

We never know when a person may have a "medical emergency/event." Preparation ahead of time and knowing what to do may save the life of the person having a medical problem. While these videos shouldn't replace a formal hands-on training, they may help in an emergency situation while 911 responders arrive.

Making a Motion

There have been questions on how we should handle motions at a Knights' meeting. Here is a brief synopsis from Robert's Rules of Order, America's foremost guide to parliamentary procedure.

1. Make the motion:

- a. The Chair recognizes member.
- b. Member makes a motion starting with, "Worth Grand Knight, I move that..."

2. Second:

- a. You need a second to proceed with the motion. A second does not mean that member approves, but only that you want to proceed.
- b. If there is no second, the motion dies.

3. Call the question:

- a. Each member has the opportunity to express their view or ask questions.
- b. Members must respect those by not interrupting or having side discussions.
- c. The Chair may limit the time each member to comment.
- d. A motion may be amended.
 - i. Make motion to amend by saying, "Worth Grand Knight, I move that we amend the motion to..."
 - ii. A second is required. If no second, the amendment fails.
 - iii. Call the question.
- e. If the motion is incomplete or needs further review and investigation, the motion can be tabled until the next meeting.

4. Vote on the motion / amended motion:

- a. Reread the motion for clarity before taking the vote.
- b. A majority vote required to pass for most Knights' motions.
- c. The Chair can vote or abstain.
- d. A Tie Vote
 - i. If the Chair did not vote, he can cast the deciding vote.
 - ii. A Tie Vote is not a majority, so the motion fails.

It is highly recommended that the person wanting to present a motion at a general membership meeting properly prepares and submits his motion in writing to the Officers before their Officers' Meeting the week before. This will allow time to vet the motion, ask for additional clarification or time to investigate potential issues. This review and investigation should help determine the best possible way to present.

All of this leads to better motions, a more efficient process and less confusion. Thank you for your assistance and understanding.
