


From the Desk of Father Beau:

"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him or knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you." Jn 14:16-17

"Which person of the trinity do your prayers tend to be directed towards?" That question, overheard one day at seminary, profoundly impacted my prayer life and relationship with God. Up to that point I knew the truth of the triune God, but it had no conscious impact on our relationship. What I realized after that moment was my lack of relationship, and so love for, the Father even more so the Holy Spirit. My unconscious focus towards Jesus or generically "God" hindered my love for the whole being the He is, a problem I made an immediate, conscious effort to remedy.

Both because God is not solitary, but three and our existence in time we can grow in our love for each person of the trinity or fail in our relationship with each. Our love for God is the measure of our holiness, so entering into a more profound relationship with each person consciously, will allow us to have a more intense love for the triune being that is God. Which person, Father, Son, or Holy Spirit, should you learn more about as well as devote specific, conscious attention to in prayer?
