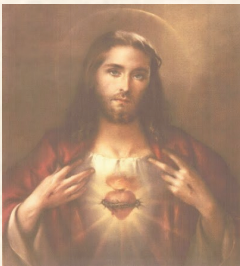

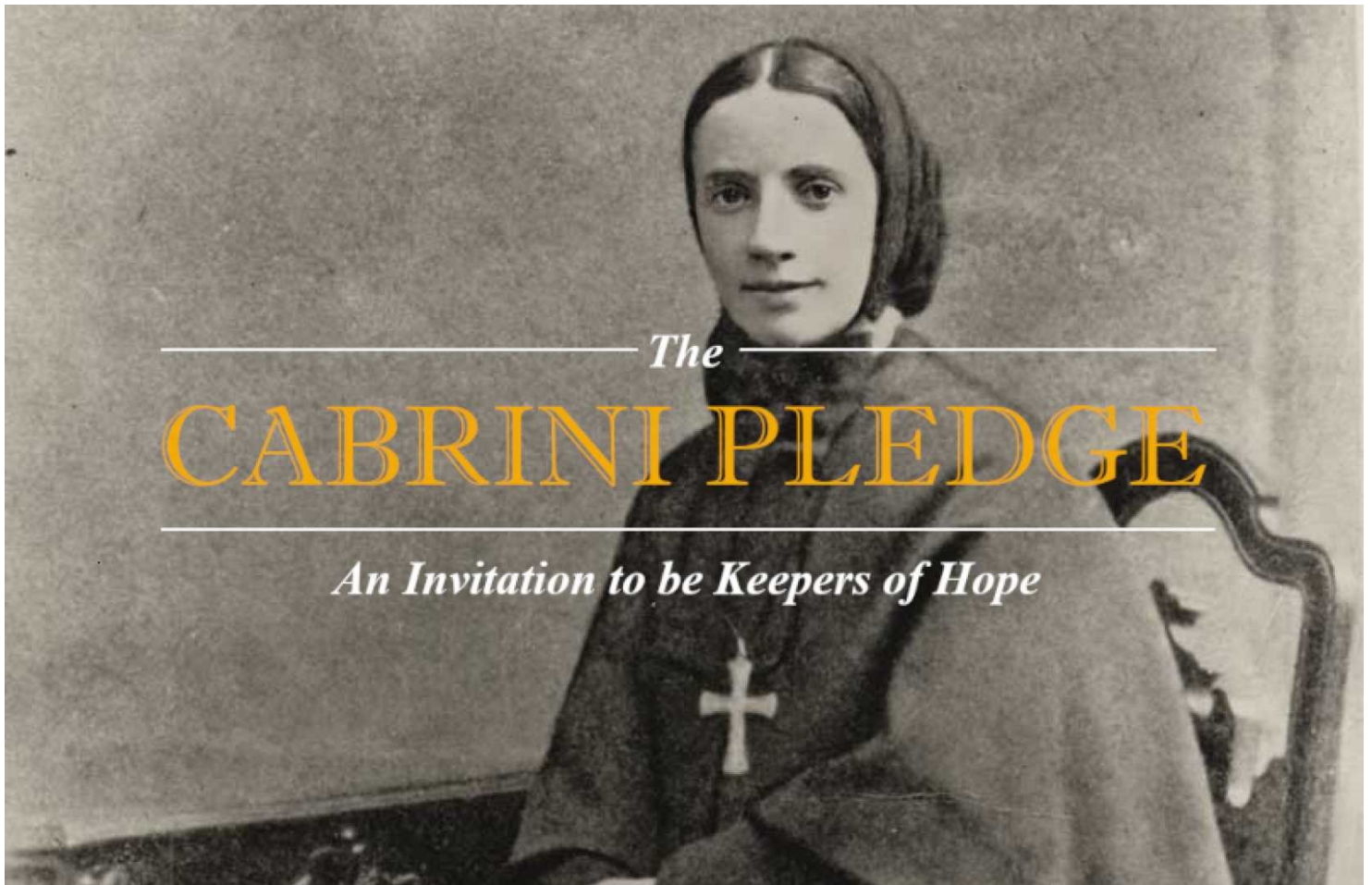
Mother Cabrini's Feast Day—November 13

As part of the celebration, Bishop Turley and Sister Laura gave heartfelt and uplifting talks inspired by Pope Leo's recent apostolic exhortation "Dilexi te" - "I loved you".

Bishop Turley explained how Pope Leo finished the document that was begun by Pope Francis, and then spoke very movingly about Jesus' love for us, especially the poor, and what our response should be. Sister Laura recounted special moments of feeling loved on the Sisters' recent trip to Rome, and then encouraged everyone to consider the Cabrini pledge.

The homemade banner shown below went with them to Rome, and was spotted by Pope Leo.

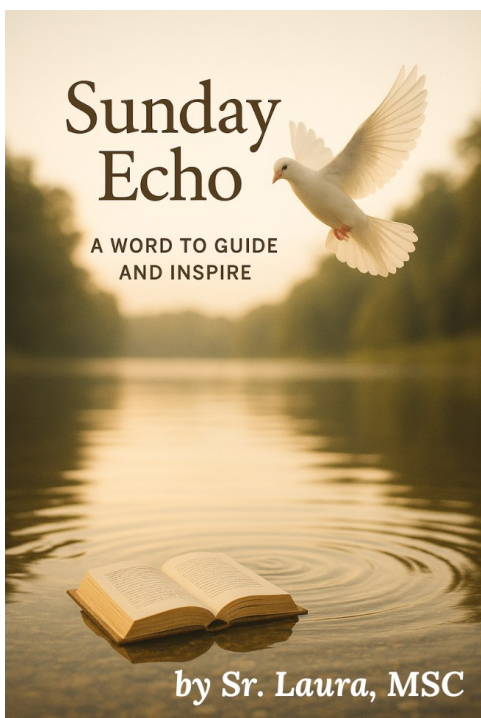




I PLEDGE:

- **To affirm, in word and deed, the inherent dignity of every person**, regardless of immigration status or country of origin, seeing each as a child of God before all else.
- **To engage with Scripture and the Church's social teaching**, reflecting on the role of migration in salvation history, the history of the United States, and the history of my own family.
- **To listen and learn about the circumstances facing migrants and refugees**, including those in my community, with an open heart and mind.
- **To seek opportunities for encounter**, so as to grow in deeper understanding and communion that leads to an authentic solidarity with those in need.
- **To consider what it means to be a good neighbor** and how I am called to reflect the love and hope of Christ to others.
- **To encourage civic dialogue that places the human person and the sanctity of families at the center of policymaking**, especially toward the end of meaningful immigration reform.
- **To join with Pope Leo in praying for all migrants and refugees** as fellow travelers on the journey to our true homeland.

Mother Cabrini - Quote of the Week

From “My Retreat St. Michael’s Feast”
September 1902, Codogno, Italy

“After a long month of travel, how consoling it is for me to make the Spiritual Exercises, to look into my soul and compare it with the Heart of my Jesus, to see if all my attitudes are similar to his and can give him pleasure. May my guides be: Mary, my caring Mother, St. Joseph, my teacher and St. Michael, the special angel of the Institute. May I learn from this experience for the greater glory of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the sanctification of my soul.

Love Heart of my Jesus, enlighten my intellect with your Holy Spirit, so that I may always know both you and myself more deeply. Bind my spirit to you in a truly special way and move my will to act on all those resolutions whereby I may console your Divine Heart and make reparation for the new agony of these difficult days caused by ignorant and ungrateful sinners. Sweet Jesus, I offer myself to your Divine Heart. Do with me what you want, as long as reparation is made to your Divine Heart and many poor souls are saved. If you just point your powerful finger, all will be done. Jesus, with your grace, dispose of me and all that is mine just as you desire. I surrender myself into your hands, to your Divine Heart, with the greatest indifference possible.”
