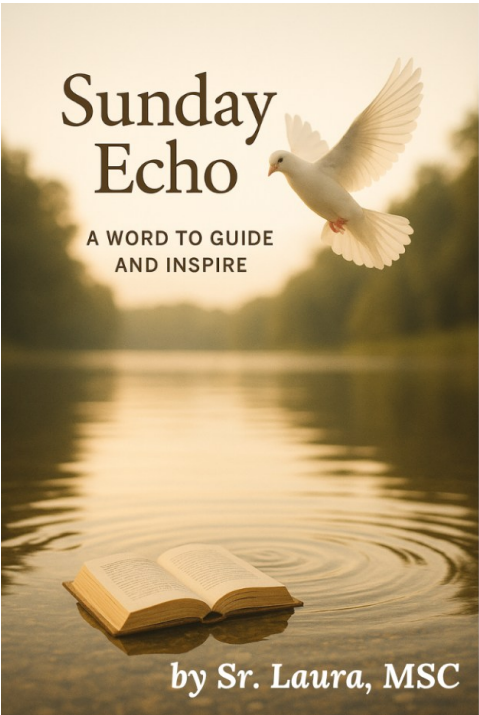




I PLEDGE:

“Now that the sisters are well, they have decided to have recourse to the souls in purgatory before the weather changes. Those blessed souls can no longer do anything for themselves, but we can do a great deal for them. Let us have compassion on them.
