Mother Cabrini - Quote of the Week

From “My Retreat on the Feast of All Saints”
November 1, 1910, London

“In order to build a temple in your heart and unite yourself with Christ in God, you must impose silence on all your enemies—that is, your disordered passions—and win a decisive victory by making them submit to you. The victory over the passions is the first step in arriving at an interior life. God does not reside in a heart that is enslaved with passions. Reason, faith and the example of the saints together will show you that a true spiritual life cannot be achieved without painfully struggling against your disordered passions. The combat is necessary for everyone—without exception! The battle is more or less painful according to the abundance of grace and the strength of the passions.

Humility is the most indispensable virtue for the interior life. God himself in Holy Scripture tells us that he abhors pride and its offspring. He resists the proud and humbles them, while he is pleased to raise up the humble and give himself to them. Humility is the foundation of faith, the beautiful daughter of God, the cornerstone of our holy religion. It is the basis of Christian discipline and the beginning of eternal salvation. The work and excellence of humility are beyond compare.”
