Grades 6 - 8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Cyberbullying – The use of digital devices, sites, and apps to intimidate, harm, and upset someone is a negative effect of technology. Two ways we can help someone who is affected by cyberbullying are by being an Upstander and/or an Ally. Remember this from class? An Upstander stands up to a bully by telling a trusted adult or directly confronting them while an Ally supports the person being bullied. Both are important but being an Upstander is best! Don't be a Bystander! ● Talk about this activity with your family. Be courageous and kind. Always be an Upstander!
