



A note from your DRE...

On this 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time in the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 13, we hear the familiar parable of sowing seeds. This perhaps should have been a readily understood example in Jesus' time, as people didn't have the multiple stores to purchase food like we do. However, many still did not understand. Jesus says, "But blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear." The parable of the sower of the seeds is still relevant in our lives. today. I think there are times that we can be like all of the four "hearers" in this parable. When we hear the Word of God, sometimes we don't understand it, other times it doesn't last very long, other times we lose it in "worldly anxiety." Then there are times when others see Christ by our actions. I pray that we make space for God's Word and Will in our hearts.

Returning to our summer discussion of the Ten Commandments, the seventh commandment is "You shall not steal." Like the other commandments, this is more than just property theft. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church 2401, "it commands justice and charity in the care of earthly goods and the fruits of men's labor. For the sake of the common good, it requires respect for the universal destination of goods and respect for the right to private property." Yet, we are required to be a steward of God's gifts and practice the virtues of temperance and justice for a "moderate attachment to this world's goods" and "preserve our neighbor's rights and render him what he is due" (CCC 2407). This section of the catechism also includes how we use/ treat God's earth (CCC 2415), just wage (2434), and practicing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy (CCC 2447). The Catechism also specifically addresses the Church's position on communism, socialism, and capitalism (CCC 2425) along with justice and solidarity among nations (CCC 2437-2442). It even addresses card games or gambling (CCC 2413), which "are not in themselves contrary to justice. They become morally unacceptable when they deprive someone of what is necessary to provide for his needs and those of others."

Our VBS curriculum this year covered the topic, "Earthkeepers - Adventures for Creation Care Kids", based on Pope Francis' encyclical, 'Laudato si.' You can print that and any encyclical free from http:// w2.vatican.va/content/vatican/en.html

K-8 Religious Education Program

We have made some changes to the program this year. To allow families to spend more time together, we are moving the class time to 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM. This allows families to attend the Mass that is most convenient, maintains the ease of parking/ transportation flow, and the children do not have to stay past noon for their religious education. We will have donuts and juice prior to class. As there are a small number of students in some grades, we are combining classrooms to K-1, 2-3, 4-6, & 7-8.1 have invited our incoming 8th graders for the Sacrament Confirmation to provide help in the classrooms as a project for service hours. Not only will this help with the children in the program, but will allow others considering a teaching vocation some practical experience. We have adopted a new curriculum that matches the Gospel reading from that particular Sunday, and has a handout to go home with the child each week. They will work in an age appropriate book each week, and that book will go home with the children at the end of the year. Please contact the office if you have any questions or concerns.

Please prayerfully consider if this ministry may be calling you. Please review the calendar posted to the website. I realize this is a significant time commitment, however due to holidays or events at the Church, there are some weeks without classes. If you are unsure what you would teach in the classroom, there is a specific lesson plan for each week's class, and the children will be working in a book written for their gae level. Forming Good Stewards

Matthew 28:16-20

"Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations . . . " After his resurrection Jesus revealed himself to his disciples who had been his most faithful followers to prepare them for the day when he would return to his Father and no longer be physically with them. Jesus knew it would take time for them to fully realize the meaning of all they had seen and heard; they would be uncertain and fearful about how to proceed with out him to lead and teach them; they would have to choose whether or not to accept the task of carrying on his mission and teaching others his message by their words and actions. After they saw Jesus ascend to his Father they banded together in anxiety and uncertainty. We may be tempted to judge them harshly for their lack of faith and courage. But what would we have done? They believed in Jesus but they had witnessed many unusual and frightening things. They stayed together and resolved their doubts and conquered their fears. When we have doubts and fears do we stay together? Do we spend time in prayer to resolve our doubts and act with courage?
