

A Note from your DRE...

On this 7th Sunday of Easter in the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 28, we read about Jesus' Ascension into Heaven and receive our commission. Jesus instructs us to "make disciples of all nations", "teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you". Here, Jesus creates "the Magisterium" or Teaching Authority of the Church.

To continue the discussion about the 10 commandments, our media culture would have us believe they are restrictive and limit our freedom. However, that is not the case. We can readily see the effects to this day, that slavery caused in our own country. Remember, the Israelites were slaves in Egypt for over 400 years. They made bricks in the hot dessert, and suffered the same atrocities of being overworked, beaten, sold, murdered, and tortured. When God has Moses lead the people out of Egypt, there were no rules, laws, or societal order. God forms them into a nation, aives them laws to auide their behavior and worship, and gives them a priesthood and leadership structure. The commandments were liberating – don't murder, steal, or take other's wives or children, have a day of rest, and honor your parents instead of killing them when they can no longer work. And, most importantly, love the Lord your God, who will live among his people in the Ark of the Covenant.

Forming Good Stewards

Matthew 28:16-20

"Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations . . . " After his resurrection Jesus revealed himself to his disciples who had been his most faithful followers to prepare them for the day when he would return to his Father and no longer be physically with them. Jesus knew it would take time for them to fully realize the meaning of all they had seen and heard; they would be uncertain and fearful about how to proceed with out him to lead and teach them; they would have to choose whether or not to accept the task of carrying on his mission and teaching others his message by their words and actions. After they saw Jesus ascend to his Father they banded together in anxiety and uncertainty. We may be tempted to judge them harshly for their lack of faith and courage. But what would we have done? They believed in Jesus but they had witnessed many unusual and frightening things. They stayed together and resolved their doubts and conquered their fears. When we have doubts and fears do we stay together? Do we spend time in prayer to resolve our doubts and act with courage?

Intercultural competencies workshop in June

On June 6-8, 2017, the Diocese of Owensboro will host a workshop titled "Building Intercultural Competence for Ministers," held at Mount St. Joseph Conference and Retreat Center in Maple Mount. Participants will learn how to better frame issues of diversity in terms of the Church's identity and mission to evangelize; seek an understanding of culture and how it works; develop intercultural communication skills in pastoral settings; expand one's knowledge of the obstacles which impede effective intercultural relations; and foster ecclesial integration rather than assimilation in church settings, with a spirituality of reconciliation and mission. The workshop cost is \$30 and includes all materials and meals. Lodging is also available at the retreat center for \$30/night. Learn more at owensborodiocese.org/bicmworkshop/.
