A note from your DRE...

From the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 22 this week, Jesus gives us a parable of the king who invited people to a wedding feast. In those the days, a wedding feast was a significant event for the individuals and community. Some who were invited refused to attend. They were invited again, and this time some ignored the invitation and went away on vacation, others went to work, and others killed the messengers who invited them. Then, the king invited everyone else to attend the wedding feast, yet throws someone out for not wearing a wedding garment, saying "many are invited, but few are chosen."

The first part of this parable is perhaps easier to understand. The wedding feast is the Kingdom of Heaven, the king is God, and we can be the people who sometime refuse the invitation for a variety of different reasons. But, why would the man not wearing a wedding garment be thrown out? The analogy is being "clothed in Christ," or in other words, being Baptized in Christ. Having no wedding garment suggests someone who initially responded to God's invitation, but did not continue life in Christ. I pray this week that we respond to God's invitation in our lives.

Since 1972, October has been acknowledged as Respect for Life month, dedicated to increasing a greater culture of life through education, public policy, and prayer. For each week in October, I'll include a post about what the Catholic Church teaches on the sanctity and dignity of human life. The practice of euthanasia is ending the life of a sick or dying person. From 2277, "An act or omission which, of itself or by intention, causes death in order to eliminate suffering constitutes a murder gravely contrary to the dignity of the human person and to the respect due to the living God, his Creator." CCC 2278 discusses when it is appropriate to discontinue medical procedures and under what conditions; and CCC 2279 views palliative care as a "special form of disinterested charity [that] should be encouraged" This Sunday, October 15 is scripture Sunday. Have you ever tried Lectio Divina? Since the 12th Century, this Latin term for "divine reading", describes a way of reading the Scriptures where we gradually let go of our own agenda and open ourselves to what God wants to say to us. The first stage is to read the scripture, next is to reflect, third is to respond, and fourth is to rest. There are bookmarks at the doors of church to insert in your Bible and help you to try this method of reading scripture. If you have questions about Lectio Divina, any of our Religious Education programs, or faith formation needs, please let me know.

What Is A Deacon?

What tasks do Deacons perform?

As minister of the word, a deacon proclaims the Gospel, preaches, and teaches in the name of the Church. As Minister of Sacrament, a deacon may baptize, lead the faithful in prayer, witness marriages, and conduct wake and funeral services. As Minister of Charity, a deacon is a leader in identifying the needs of others and in calling God's people into service to meet those needs.

As an individual, the Permanent Deacon maintains his current job and family life. Through his ordination, he is committed to a lifelong ministry of worship, word, and service. The Permanent Deacon neither replaces nor inhibits the ministry of the priest or the laity of the Church. The Permanent Deacon's role is unique and its focus is to be a living reminder of Christ the Servant present in the Church and world today.

Tri Parish Mission

Each of our past two Tri Parish Missions called us to open our lives more to Jesus. The guestion is "How wide are we opening the door?" Are we treating the Lord like an unwelcomed sales person and are disinterested in what He has to offer, OR do we openly welcome the Lord like a very special friend?
