

A note from your DRE...

From the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 21 this week, Jesus gives us the familiar parable of the landowner planting a vineyard, leasing it to tenants, and sending servants and finally his son to reap its produce. The landowner is God, the tenants are the leaders of Israel, the sent servants are the prophets, and the son is Jesus. In the parable, after the tenants beat and kill the servants, the landowner says, "They will respect my son." As we know, they also kill the son. The treatment of the son seems desperate and illogical. What could the tenants have hoped to gain? Jesus then proclaims, "the stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone." Have we ever rejected Jesus? Perhaps not intentionally, but as human beings with concupiscence - the inclination to sin - we have. Participate in the sacraments, encounter Christ, and be an example of excellence.

Since 1972, October has been acknowledged as Respect for Life month, dedicated to increasing a greater culture of life through education, public policy, and prayer. For each week in October, I'll include a post about what the Catholic Church teaches on the sanctity and dignity of human life. Thus, on the subject of abortion, CCC 2271, "Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion." CCC 2270, "Human life must be respected and protected from the moment of conception." Faith, science, and reason all concur that human life begins at conception. Sadly, abortion has been practiced in society throughout history. While this is a grave offence, CCC 2272, "The Church does not thereby intend to restrict the scope of mercy." Thus, if a person has cooperated in procuring an abortion, God's mercy is available through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Both K-8 Religious Education and RCIA are not in session this Sunday for Fall Break. The home page of the church website has been and will be updated monthly with a list of upcoming events at the Parish. Sunday, October 15 is Scripture Sunday. Have you ever tried Lectio Divina? Since the 12th Century, this Latin term for "divine reading", describes a way of reading the Scriptures where we gradually let go of our own agenda and open ourselves to what God wants to say to us. The first stage is to read the scripture, next is to reflect, third is to respond, and fourth is to rest. There are bookmarks at the doors of church to insert in your Bible and help you to try this method of reading scripture. If you have questions about Lectio Divina, any of our Religious Education programs, or faith formation needs, please let me know.

What Is A Deacon?

A Ministry Of Service

The call to be a deacon is a Call to serve. The symbol of the ministry of the deacon is the basin and towelthe items Jesus used when he washed the feet of the apostles, illustrating how we are called to love and serve others. In particular, permanent deacons have a special ministry to serve those in need-the hungry, homeless, sick, in prison, or immigrants. He sees that they are not forgotten or excluded from the lituraical and communal life of the Church. Deacons are assigned by the bishop to ministries for which the bishop perceives a great need and for which the deacon may have special gifts or talents. Most often, this will be within a parish setting, just as most priests serve in a parish. Once assigned to the parish, the deacon ministers under the immediate supervision of the pastor.

As Deacon Brett Mills' responsibilities become more, Deacon Bill Bach's public ministry will become less. We would like to thank Deacon Bill for his five years of service and ministry. Bishop Medley stated, "He will be remembered as one of our pioneers who opened the doors for men who would follow and make great contributions to the Church."

Scripture Sunday 2017

Mark your calendar for Scripture Sunday 2017 in the Diocese of Owensboro! In Pope Francis' apostolic letter, Misericordia et misera, he explained that the Year of Mercy reminds us that mercy isn't only for a specially-designated year, but is part of the ongoing life of the Church. He said it would be a good idea if "every Christian community, on one Sunday of the liturgical year, could renew its efforts to make the Sacred Scriptures better known." Following up on Pope Francis' suggestion, Bishop William F. Medley has designated the third Sunday of October as Scripture Sunday in the Diocese of Owensboro.
