A note from your DRE...

In this week's reading from the Gospel of Mark Chapter 10, James and John, two of Jesus' inner circle of disciples, go to Jesus and ask if they can sit at his right and his left. This would be a reference to a monarchy where the king sits on his throne, and those sitting next to him would also be authority figures, with delegated powers from the king. Upon hearing this request, the other disciples become "indignant" towards James and John and they too want to plead their case for 2nd & 3rd in command. If you remember last week's Gospel reading, just 5 verses earlier, the disciples were boasting how they had "given up everything" to follow Jesus.

Apparently, they didn't give up their desire to be in charge. Jesus talks about the secular rulers who "make their authority over them felt." If you have ever had a bad boss who "makes their authority felt," then you know what that means. Thus, Jesus reminds the disciples then, as well as us today that "whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all." This certainly runs contradictory to our current culture where many follow athletes, celebrities, or politicians because of their wealth and perceived greatness. It can also be found in our own families as we struggle with "who is right," "who is in charge," and "who gets the credit." I pray this week this week that we put Jesus' words into action and serve others.

Religious Education and RCIA are out again this week as we recognize Fr Mike for Priest Appreciation Sunday. Join us for food and games. Teaching Wednesday is in session this week.
