

A note from your DRE...

On this 4th Sunday of Advent from the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 1, we hear the origins of the Holy Family. Before they were married, "the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her" (20). "When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home" (24). You thought you were nervous before your wedding day. Or, maybe you think there are/ were too many expectations on you in your marriage. Mary and Joseph were asked to nurture and raise the Son of God. In last week's Gospel, the followers of John the Baptist asked Jesus for a sign. In this week's Gospel, Joseph receives a sign and does what the Lord commands him. It is said that God hears and answers all prayers, just not always in the way we want them. So, when I buy the occasional ticket and ask God to let me win the lottery, he doesn't send me the money. However, while I am originally disappointed, I am able to later recognize that God blessed me in some other way that week. As a righteous Hebrew, Joseph prays daily and is ready to carry out God's will. Can we say the same? Let us pray this day we recognize the signs God sends to us.
