

A note from your DRE...

On this 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time from the Gospel of Luke Chapter 18, Jesus tells us a familiar parable about "those who were convinced of their own righteousness." Jesus then tells us about the Pharisee who exalts himself while the tax collector who humbles himself. Are we righteous? Or, am I convinced of my own righteousness? What does that even mean? As Catholics, we believe God initiates our salvation through grace. We cannot earn righteousness by our own efforts, only when we have faith in Jesus, and perform Corporal and Spiritual works of mercy in obedience in God. Can you name all the works of mercy? Maybe more importantly, are you performing them? The Corporal works of mercy are feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, visit the sick, visit the prisoners, and bury the dead. You may also know "clothe the naked" as give alms to the poor. The Spiritual works of mercy are counseling the doubtful, instructing the ignorant, admonishing the sinner, comforting the sorrowful, forgiving injuries, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead. It sure takes a lot to be righteous, which is why we cannot do it on our own. Let us pray this day we ask God for the grace to perform acts of mercy towards each other.

October seems to be over so fast. For those of you who take a Fall Break vacation, I hope you enjoyed it. This is a really busy week with Priest Appreciation Sunday, Halloween costumes and trick-or-treating, All Saint's Day, and All Soul's Day.
