Forming Good Stewards April 26, 2020 Third Sunday of Easter Luke 24:13-35

"And it happened that, while he was with them at the table,

he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them."

When Jesus encountered two disciples on the road to Emmaus it is clear that they did not understand all he had endured. He bluntly tells them, "Oh, how foolish you are! How slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke!" Despite his disappointment he did not abandon the two disciples, but "beginning with Moses and all the prophets, he interpreted to them what referred to him in all the Scriptures." To paraphrase St. Augustin, Jesus is hidden in the Old Testament, and revealed in the New. How fortunate we are to have the faith of the apostles, the many disciples who followed them, and billions of Christians over two thousand years who believed that Jesus is the fulfillment of God's promise of salvation, forgiveness of sins and eternal life. Are we grateful for the gift of their faith? Do we accept and nurture our faith by daily or frequently reading God's Word revealed to us in the Old and New Testaments? When is the last time we read Sacred Scripture and listened for God to speak to us?

A note from your DRE...

On this 3rd Sunday of Easter from the Gospel of Luke Chapter 24, Jesus joins two disciples on the road to Emmaus following His Resurrection. After teaching them the Scriptures, and offering the Eucharist, the disciples said, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?" The road to Emmaus is similar to our Mass today. First, we hear the Scriptures, then we are taught about the Scriptures, then we receive the Eucharist, and then we are sent to proclaim the good news to others. Let us pray this day that we recognize Jesus walking along side us.

In this COVID19 time, I'm still in the office answering emails and phone calls. I received a call from someone inquiring about RCIA, and I explained the current situation. As we continued the conversation, this person went on to ask what they could be doing in the interim, and asked me how to pray. Well, I immediately went into catechist mode and began teaching. It was only after the conversation that I was humbled as to what an enormous opportunity that was. One of the disciples asked Jesus that question. Thankfully, since I knew how Jesus responded (Luke 11:1-4), I provided the same information.

How do I pray? This is some of the information I shared in that conversation and that we also teach in RCIA. I use the acronym **FAITH**, which means to say a pray of Forgiveness, Adoration, Intercession, Thanksgiving, and to Hear the Word of God. I try to pray for an hour a day, using a combination of memorized prayers (Confiteor, Act of Contrition, Angelus, and Lord's Prayer), meditation, contemplative prayer, and reading the Scriptures. This works for me, but it may not work for you. Ultimately, our prayer life is our relationship with God. How does your relationship with God compare to other relationships in your life? Let us pray for mercy for ourselves and others as we abundantly live through time.

In these dark days, we invite all Catholics of Western Kentucky to engage in a project meant to communicate faith and hope to our neighbors and be a sign of encouragement and support to all who are suffering.



Beginning at 8:00 PM on April 11, Holy Saturday, and through May 31, Pentecost Sunday, use the symbol of light as an outward sign in some way on your property as a witness to all of the prayers burning in our hearts and as a reminder that the light has come into our world and has conquered even death.

Bring out the Christmas lights you have stored away. Wrap a strand around a door or window, visible to all who pass. Place a flower wreath on a door and weave through it a strand of light. Two stands of lights can be used to form a cross on a garage door. Strings of light can be woven through bushes, or even a small tree. The candles you put in your windows at Christmas can be placed there once again. Be creative!

Each night, as you "turn on the lights", you might also light a candle and say a prayer to the one "who sheds his peaceful light on all humanity" (the *Exsultet* from the Easter Vigil) for an end to the pandemic.
