

A note from your DRE...

On this 12th Sunday in Ordinary time from the Gospel of Matthew Chapter 10:28, Jesus said, "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." As our country continues to respond to the pandemic, we are again challenged by an extreme act of racism. The response has been mostly peaceful protests, with some non-peaceful riots, but even worse, more division. It is this division that can kill our soul. Included in the definition of the Greek word for the devil as the divider is, diábolos, "to condemn to sever a relationship." From Romans 12:5, Saint Paul says "so we, though many, are one body in Christ." When we encounter the devil attempting to divide us, we should respond as Jesus did, "Get away, Satan!" (Matthew 4:10). Let us pray this day that we trust in God's words and pray to strive for unity.

I don't know about you, but this currently doesn't feel like "ordinary time." When it comes to that phrase, let's consider what the USCCB teaches us. "Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe."

Forming Good Stewards

June 21, 2020 Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time Matt 10:26-33

"Nothing is concealed that will not be revealed, nor secret that will not be known."

That cannot be good news for anybody. We all have skeletons in our closets that we hope will stay there. But Jesus was not speaking about our faults and failures being exposed. He was talking about the responsibility that comes with our Baptism: to know and to proclaim the Good News about God's unconditional love for us by what we say and do; by our words and actions. If what we do is not reflective and consistent with what we say, others will know that we are a hypocrite. That skeleton will be out of the closet. Happily, we have the assurance of Jesus that everyone who acknowledges and imitates Him by what we say and do, He will acknowledge before His heavenly Father. Imagine standing with Jesus and hearing Him say, "Father, this is my friend, [insert your name], who acknowledged me before others by word and deed." And the Father says, "Come, enter into my Kingdom!" WOW!

Last week, seven U.S. bishop chairmen of committees within the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a statement in the wake of the death of Mr. George Floyd and the protests that have broken out in Minneapolis and other cities in the United States. Their statement included a plea to all Catholics to pray and work for healing and peace:

[W]e call upon all Catholics to pray and work toward a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Let us pray for a supernatural desire to rid ourselves of the harm that bias and prejudice cause. We call upon Catholics to pray to the Holy Spirit for the Spirit of Truth to touch the hearts of all in the United States and to come down upon our criminal justice and law enforcement systems. Finally, let each and every Catholic, regardless of their ethnicity, beg God to heal our deeply broken view of each other, as well as our deeply broken soci-
