Monday March 23rd Bishop William F. Medley communicated with all priests regarding several new directives. A few of those have been outlined for you below, along with some other related information:

Bishop Medley is suspending the celebration of public Masses until further notice.

The diaconate ordination of seminarian Corey Bruns, as well as the celebration of Chrism Mass, are both being postponed. No dates have been determined at this time.

Bishop Medley is also requesting that all parish offices:

- Close parish offices to visitors;
- Appointment-only in-person meetings utilizing social distancing guidelines;
- Operate with fewer staff, potentially achieving this by rotating schedules; and Always adhere to the CDC and governmental guidelines/regulations especially in terms of social distancing. (These can be found at <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/index.html> and <https://govstatus.egov.com/kycovid19>)

Lastly, Bishop Medley invites all parishes in the Diocese of Owensboro to join with Governor Andy Beshear's request to ring church bells daily at 10:00 AM. Bishop Medley is asking everyone to pause at this moment and to offer our prayer for an end to the coronavirus pandemic. If a parish does not have bells, parishioners are encouraged to set their alarms to remind them to stop for a moment and pray. Even though we cannot gather in prayer, we can still be united in prayer.

The Office of Worship has created a resource for prayer at home during the Coronavirus outbreak called the *Diocese of Owensboro Prayer Companion*. In addition, each week that Mass is suspended, they will be sharing an adapted Liturgy of the Word for use by the faithful at home that is specific to each Sunday. Each week's Liturgy of the Word will include a short reflection on the readings by one of our Diocesan Priests.

A note from your DRE...

On this 5th Sunday of Lent from the Gospel of John Chapter 11, we hear that Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead. "The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, 'Untie him and let him go' (44)." Why did Lazarus have to suffer and die? Wouldn't it have been easier if Jesus had just healed Lazarus when he was just sick? Jesus had a plan and a reason. God similarly has a plan for our lives. With the impact of COVID19, it is difficult to understand this as a part of God's plan. Based on what you read, this is a lethal pandemic that will decimate America, or this is an overblown reaction by the media to make you fearful. Has something like this happened before? During the Spanish flu outbreak in 1918 in St. Louis, the then 4th largest city in the United States, Dr. Starkloff was the Health Commissioner. Per his recommendations, Mayor Henry Kiel instituted the social distancing practice, banning public gatherings of more than 20 people. This practice was successful in stopping the spread of the flu. Archbishop John Glennon also temporarily suspended the Sunday Mass obligation for Catholics. One Sunday, a phone call was made to the police as 200 people had gathered together for Mass at St. Francis de Sales Church. When the police investigated, Father Frederick Holweck told police the people snuck in through the church's side windows and he didn't see them. No arrests were made.

The Church has been through this before and will continue thereafter. However, let's not get Fr. Mike investigated by sneaking 200 people into the Church. Let us pray today for peace in our lives and our community. If you have questions about any of our Religious Education programs or faith formation needs, contact Norm Hayden at the office.

Forming Good Stewards

March 29, 2020
Fifth Sunday in Lent
John 11:1-45

“Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.”

When Jesus arrived at Bethany, a small village approximately four miles southeast of Jerusalem, he received that greeting from both Martha and Mary, the sisters of Lazarus. Their greetings reveal both faith and doubt; faith that Jesus could have prevented the death of Lazarus and doubt that he could now do anything about it. Jesus understood. Jesus taught Martha and Mary what he would later teach Thomas, “Do not persist in your unbelief, but believe” (John 21:27). If we do not occasionally doubt our faith, we may not have a faith to doubt. Jesus uses this whole episode to teach all of us that we must be good stewards of our faith. When we have doubts, do we let them linger and fester, or do we try to resolve them by seeking the counsel of our clergy, studying the teachings of our Church, or discussing them with a spiritual director or someone we can trust? If not, we may sink deeper into our doubt and jeopardize our faith.
