It has been an interesting Christmas season with December 25 falling on a Sunday this past year. The Feasts of the Holy Family and the Lord's Baptism were moved to weekdays, therefore receiving much less celebratory attention. Nonetheless, the Baptism of the Lord this past Monday concluded the Christmas season and the first week of Ordinary Time started right away.

Ordinary Time sounds so mundane after the anticipation of Advent and the celebration of Christmas. Now everything is just ordinary ... plain ... commonplace, right? Not so fast.. Do not let that word "ordinary" negate the specialness of this season! Though we are not celebrating Christmas or Easter per se, we are still celebrating Christ in the ordinariness of our everyday lives. Through the eventful—as well as the uneventful—Christ never leaves our side. Our faith calls us to be ever mindful of that presence and to LIVE in that presence no matter what is happening in our lives! That is the beautiful secret of Ordinary Time. We continue this season until the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 22, which will be here before we know it! Soak up this Happy Ordinary Time!



I assume most of you have put away Christmas trees, written thank you cards, and started New Year's diets and resolutions. I want to share one of my resolutions that I am rather excited about and eager to share. It is the **Catechism in a Year** podcast with Fr. Mike Schmitz. At this writing, I have just finished Day 10 and already my eyes have been opened even more so as to what an awesome book we have in our catechism! Don't get me wrong ... I am very familiar with it. However, it has always been a resource for me; it's something I refer to when I need information or clarification. I have never read it as a book. MISTAKE. (For me anyway.) Even in this short amount of time, my heart has been opened wider to the treasures of our faith, God's revelation and love, and who we really are. 





We will also seek some lead financial gifts to ensure that we have significant support for the campaign before broadening our reach to all parishioners.

This is an exciting time for our two parishes as we seek to lay a strong foundation for a positive future. In the coming months, you will learn much more about the campaign and the different ways you can help. In the meantime, please pray for our leaders and volunteers who will soon work diligently to ensure a successful outcome.




