# PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



Happy and Blessed Easter! Easter is the greatest and most important feast in the Church. It marks the birthday of our eternal hope. "Easter" literally means "the feast of fresh flowers." Easter is the guarantee of our own resurrection.



Jesus assured Martha at the tomb of Lazarus: "I am the Resurrection and the life; whoever believes in Me will live even though he dies." Christ will raise us up on the last day, but it is also true, in a sense, that we have already risen with Christ. By virtue of the Holy Spirit, our Christian life is already a participation in the death and Resurrection of Christ! Therefore, may we proclaim today and all days: "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it!"



Next Sunday—Divine Mercy Sunday—is a beautiful feast to recognize, embrace, and celebrate God's love, mercy, forgiveness, and grace. It was on May 23, 2000, that Pope John Paul II instituted this day of grace to memorialize the visions St. Faustina experienced of Jesus saying to her, "I want to grant complete pardon to the souls that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy." There's a great deal to be said regarding Divine Mercy, but I encourage everyone, if possible, to attend the Divine Mercy Prayers at Sacred Heart Cathedral, next Sunday, 2:00-4:00pm. This is a diocesan event and many priests will be available to hear confessions while the Divine Mercy Chaplet is prayed/sung. It is a beautiful service, I hope many of you experience it.



As Catholics, we should be so proud to live our faith and truly BE CATHOLIC! That is, to know, love, live, and share our faith with one another. Bishop Sheen once said, "There aren't ten people in the United States that hate the Catholic Church. There are thousands who don't understand, but ANYONE, anyone who understands the Church, the teachings, and the love of God can't help but love, embrace, and live the wonderful faith of our Church.

So on this Easter Sunday, I have come up with ten reasons why it is just plain awesome to be Catholic:

- 10) Better than Sunday morning cable shows.
- 9) Find out if you're still allergic to incense.
- 8) If it was good enough for Mother Teresa, it should be good enough for you.
- 7) The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a lot cheaper than therapy.
