PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE



I'm still feeling very much like the new kid on the block as I'm becoming more acquainted of the ins and outs of SJV and I'm often asked at how I'm adjusting. And yes, I am truly adjusting and feeling pretty comfortable, though I admit I've got a lot more to learn. It's that "getting to smell like sheep thing..." Patience, patience, patience.

And you're still getting used to me! One of the things we've been made aware of these past several weeks is Bishop Zinkula's initiative of Rediscovering Sundays. COVID-19 has changed many Catholic's approach to Mass and how easy it was to watch Mass on television, at our convenience. What a wonderful opportunity it was to live stream Masses, BUT that is not the same thing as being here and present at the Eucharist! Making people feel welcome and wanting to come back is important for all of us. I'm accustomed to beginning Mass with a heartfelt welcome, offering an introduction of the Mass, having everyone stand, turn toward those around you and introduce yourselves, and welcome each other as we begin our celebration! How many times have you sat beside or near someone and didn't even know who they were? This is a wonderful opportunity to introduce yourself and find out who that person or family is that's sharing in our celebrations!

Several years ago when then Bishop Amos assigned me to Sacred Heart, one of his preferences was announcing the Mass intention prior to Mass versus during the prayers of the faithful. Being the obedient priest I was (am), I became used to beginning our celebrations mentioning the Mass intention, the Mass we're celebrating, the opening hymn, and having everyone stand to welcome and begin. I'm hoping this becomes natural here at SJV! OK??!

While our gospel readings from St. John's gospel are about Eucharist, did you know that the "Eucharist" means thanksgiving? Catholics are called to give thanks for ALL of God's word

blessings and one of God's greatest gifts/blessings is the gift of Himself in the Eucharist. So we wonder just how grateful we are in recognizing these gifts. Today's gospel describes Jesus correcting the wrong attitude of his listeners who had gathered around him with wrong motive of another free lunch. What are we most thankful for in our lives? Our faith and all with which we've been blessed?

The story is told of two old friends who bumped into one another on the street one day. One of them looked forlorn, almost on the verge of tears. His friend asked, "What has the world done to you, my old friend?" The sad fellow said, "Let me tell you. Three weeks ago, an uncle died and left me \$40,000." "That's a lot of money." "But, two weeks ago, a cousin I never even knew, died, and left me \$85,000 free and clear." "Sounds like you've been blessed...." "You don't understand!" he interrupted. "Last week my great aunt passed away. I inherited almost a quarter of a million." Now he was really confused. "Then, why do you look so glum?" "This week ... nothing!" Gratitude is something that you only feel when a gift is truly appreciated.

As we continue to hear more lessons about the Eucharist, let's open our hearts in gratitude for all God's wonderful blessings!! Have a wonderful week!
