# **MITCH'S MESSAGE**

When I was in first grade, my grandmother died. Our entire family was devastated. But it was during this time that I first heard about the Rosary and novenas and saw all my relatives come together in quiet to pray together. Every night for nine days, we prayed the Rosary by candlelight, with a picture of my grandmother, a statue of the Virgin Mary, and rowdy kids running around



(present company included!). It was during this time that I memorized the prayers of the Rosary and was introduced to Jesus' mother.



When I met my wife, I began to pray the Rosary more regularly. Eventually, I began to read about where it came from, the apparitions of Our Lady around the world, and the warnings and the pleas to pray the Rosary. But as I continued to learn about her, I learned that all the greatest saints for the past few hundred years have all had a powerful devotion to the Mother of Jesus. St. Louis de Monfort said that, "she is the safest, easiest, shortest, and most perfect way of approaching Jesus," because she is perfectly united to Him! What mother would refuse a good thing for her own child? What more of a

mother who loves us more than our own mother does, when we ask of the greatest good: Jesus?

Our beloved Pope Francis puts it this way: "When the Church looks for Jesus, she always knocks at his mother's door and asks: 'Show us Jesus'. It is from Mary that the Church learns true discipleship. That is why the Church always goes out on mission in the footsteps of Mary." She's the most perfect model for evangelization in the Church, both by her perfect participation as the Mother of Jesus and by her mediation of all graces, especially the Holy Spirit who is the primary agent of evangelization.

The movie *Fatima* came out recently. It is a movie about one of the greatest and more recent apparitions of Mary. Mary appeared to three children over multiple days and performed the amazing and well-documented miracle of the dancing suns. She also stressed the great need of all the faithful to pray the Rosary, wielding a Rosary like a sword in battle. Imagine that. Based on the trailer alone, I could tell it was very well made (unlike many older Catholic movies \*shudder\*). The apparition is an approved apparition of the Church.

# Challenge Time!

- If you don't already do this, experience the powerful intercession of Our Lady by praying a Novena of the Rosary. So that's nine days straight of praying the Rosary and just flood her with all your needs and the needs of our Church, especially for those called to the priesthood and the religious life to attune their hearts to the voice of the Holy Spirit.



#### Inspiration for the week

It is not easy to confront someone who has wronged or hurt us. But it is absolutely necessary to do so in order for reconciliation to occur. We are taught to mind our own business and keep our thoughts to ourselves. When we have been hurt or wronged and we do not acknowledge and give voice to it, those feelings of hurt remain in our hearts and can eventually turn into anger. Verbalizing our feelings can diffuse them, and communicating how we actually feel brings honesty to our relationships. This is the only way that the path of love can remain open and that integrity and mutual respect can be maintained. It is no wonder that Jesus absolutely insisted upon healthy and compassionate confrontation. People don't always realize that they are doing harm. Bringing this to light is not only good for the one who is hurt but for the one who caused the pain. The new insight and revelation may prevent the action from being repeated again.

### **Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

It's all about reconciliation and conversion, not punishment. Relationships are not static adventures but wonderful gifts that continue to develop, grow, change, and mature. We are meant to be social beings, so isolating ourselves from others is rarely helpful. But, because human beings are on the one hand tremendously gifted, talented, and blessed creations, they are on the other also flawed, broken, and sinful. We all need to humbly admit that we are works in progress and not only capable of enriching each other's lives but causing deep hurts and wounds as well. Hence, we always need to be reconciled. We are always growing, changing, and expanding our knowledge of who we are and how we are meant to share life together.

Because reconciliation and conversion are always part of the mix of life, honesty is crucial. Without honesty, we can easily find ourselves living a lie and causing more harm than good. Being able to freely share our feelings, especially those involving pain and hurt, is a charism necessary to pursue and an art to learn. When we are wronged or wrong someone else, we do not enjoy the confrontation that can and needs to come. We are taught to keep our feelings to ourselves, especially when they are negative, and we tend to avoid difficult conversations. Hence, we never really learn how to confront another, successfully resolve conflict, find reconciliation, and welcome conversion. When we hurt or wrong someone, it does not mean that we are a bad or sinful person who deserves only punishment and excommunication. Quite the opposite! We are simply a human person who can make poor choices and sin and can be forgiven. We can restore and deepen the relationship that has been affected and find our way home again.

Jesus clearly wants to avoid shame because it has no purpose in achieving reconciliation and conversion. All broken relationships deserve a chance at reconciliation. Every person has room for growth and a need for conversion. We have to learn to be okay with honesty and not be afraid to hear and process what someone needs to say, even if it is difficult for us to hear. Severing a relationship, both personally or with the church community as a whole, ought to definitely be a last resort and only pursued when all else has failed.




