

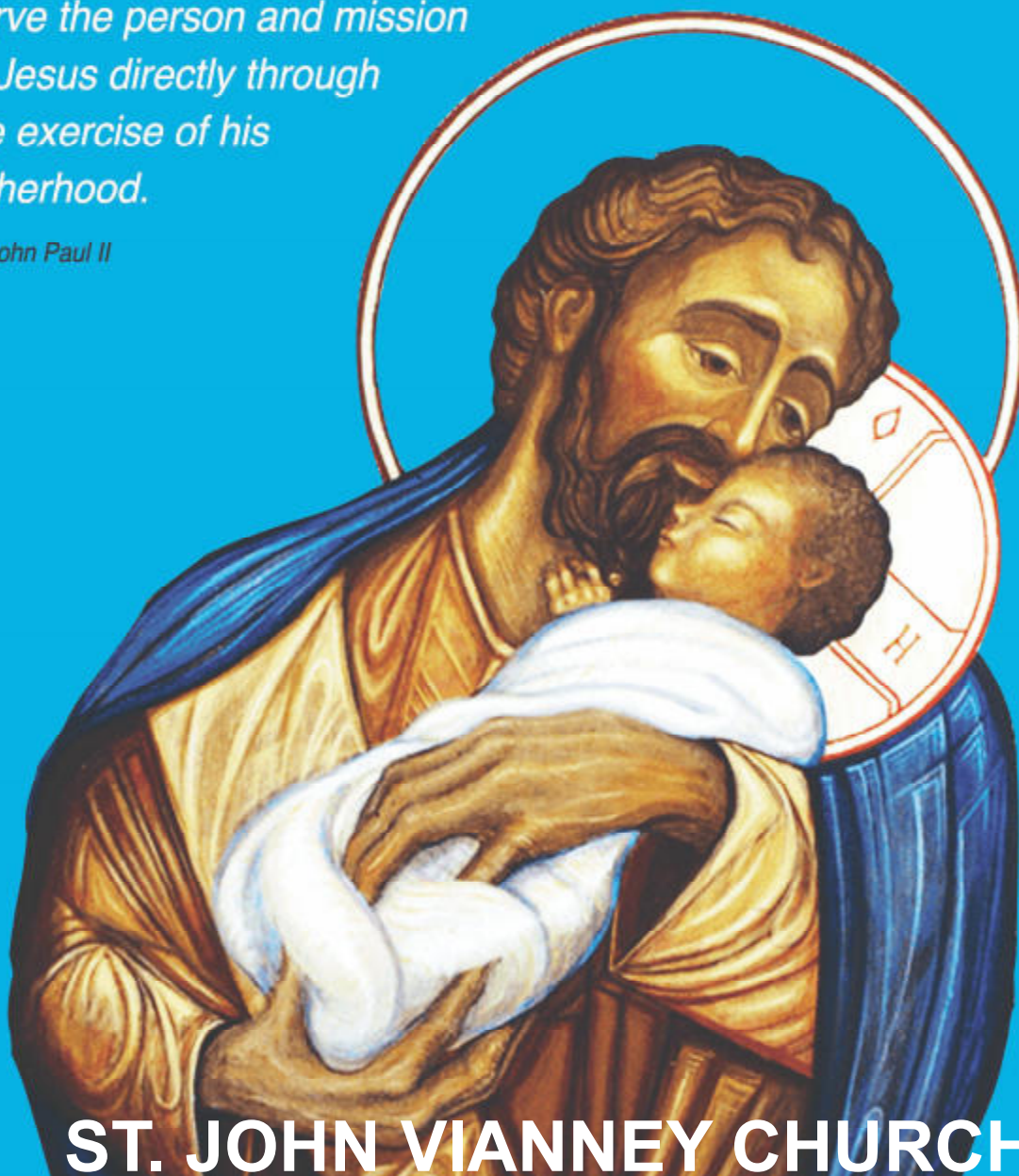

Profession of Faith—Nicene Creed

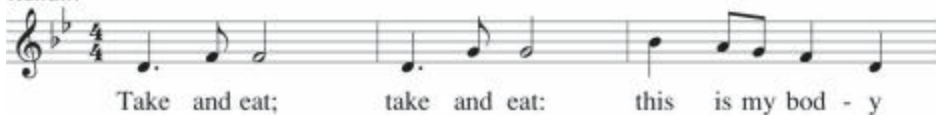

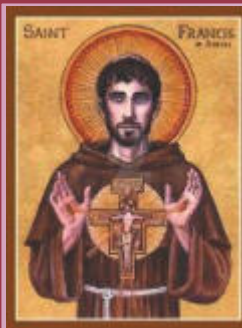

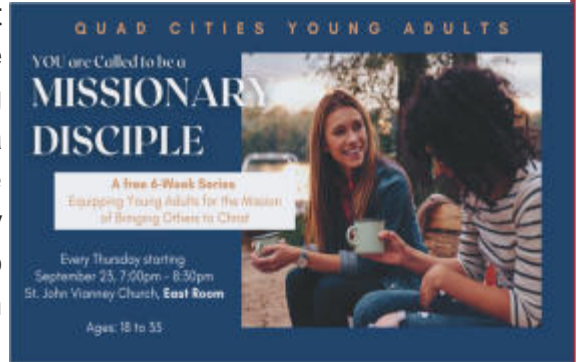


QC YOUNG ADULTS
