Homeless

50% of Homeless will find housing in 2 weeks.

40% of Homeless will find housing within 2 weeks to a year.

10% are chronically homeless, with no home after one year.

Have you ever thought that some people just don't want to work and prefer to be homeless? I know I've said it myself. Some of our guests have the resources and family to get shelter, but refuse. It seems like a choice, but is it really?

Ryan Dowd, of HomelessTraining.com offers a better point of view. Studies show that 37% of the chronically homeless are mentally ill with bipolar or schizophrenia. Another 53% have traumatic brain injury and a full 100% suffer from trauma, PTSD.

These souls are hurting. They don't function like we do because they can't. What should we do about them?

At Sophia's Kitchen, we feed them. We treat them like people. We give them compassion. We don't ask for proof of income, proof of need or even an ID. If

you come to our window and say you are hungry, we give you food. We give you a tomorrow.

RECTPE Heavenly Pasta Salad

I-16 oz package Elbow MacaroniI small onion, diced fineI-2 red, yellow or green pepper, diced

I can sweetened condensed milk
I/2 cup cider vinegar
I/4 cup sugar
I cup mayonnaise
I/2 teaspoon black pepper

I tablespoon mustard

Cook pasta until slightly firm. Drain and rinse in cold water.

Mix milk, vinegar, sugar, mayonnaise, pepper and mustard together. Pour over cold pasta and fold carefully.
Chill in fridge for 2 to 4 hours before serving.



Diabetes, high blood pressure and asthma plague the population of 61605 zip code at much higher rates than the rest of Peoria.

The reasons are not simple, but one large factor that contributes greatly is the lack of good nutrition available. A food desert and lack of transportation mean trips to the grocery store are less frequent, resulting in fewer fresh produce items in the shopping cart.

Pre-seasoned rice and pasta mixes are easy to prepare and fill hungry tummies, but are very high in sodium.

Generational poverty has taught the younger ones how to survive. It's time we help them thrive.

When we offer fresh fruits and vegetables, the response of gratefulness is tremendous. A recent grant allowed us to put display racks in the dining room filled with fresh

produce. The gasps of delight as people grab an apple or head of cabbage is great!

You'll find enclosed a nutrition policy and chart. While we will continue to take all wholesome food, we invite you to think about healthier alternatives.

Gutters

A lake sounds peaceful and wonderful on a summer day, but it was not a happy surprise in the kitchen recently.

As we investigated the source of this water, we found that the gutter on the back side of the building was hanging at a most unusual manner, and the back of the building was soaked.

Volunteers have been able to repair this spot, again. A previous patch job had failed.

Gutter companies have given bids to replace the gutters with a better size for our roof, and install guards to help with the never ending leaves. Donations are needed to help cover the cost of this repair.

Any amount that exceeds this expense will be used to add insulation in the attic, or added to a building repair fund.

This building was built in the 1970's. In general, it is in good shape, but a 50 year old building that is heavily used will need repairs now and then. Good maintenance will keep it going for many years to come.

Sophia's Kitchen has seen a steady increase in the number of people seeking help. We now serve I/3 more hungry souls as compared to last year. We expect that number to increase as the summer months come, with our greatest need in August.
