Pastor's Notes:

Thanks to everyone who helped prepare for our First Responders Prayer Service and Dinner. I especially thank those of you who personally invited first responders to come to the event. I want to thank Deacon Ed Stroesser for the prayer service sheet; Jim Haslag for organizing the men for the choir and for the men who sang in the choir; Joey Vineyard, Kathy Cardwell and Connie Schepers for reading; Carol Maxey, Carol Benna, and Linda Young for leading and organizing the dinner, and Wendy Winkelman for the countless behind the scenes tasks. And, thank you for coming and participating in the prayer, fellowship, and meal.

As mentioned in last week's Pastor's Notes, I would dedicate part of my Pastor's Notes this weekend to the administration Commission. It is important to know what this commission is responsible for so when you sign up for time and talent, you know what is being asked. The ministries that fall under the administration commission include anything that deals with property and grounds, office work and finances. The parish needs a lot of handyman/woman skills: **plumbing**; we'd rather call you than someone else if a toilet or sink leaks or break; **electrician**; we have several electrician items needed at the parish already and more will probably come as time passes. **Car-pentry**: I can give someone who is interested a list of several wood working repairs and a few new items that are needed on the parish plant. **Painting**: Parts of the parish plant can use some painting. **Grass cutting**: It is a well-oiled machine how the grass cutting happens at the parish, but they can always use more volunteers. We have a wonderful volunteer who takes care of our **landscaping and grounds keeping**, but I am sure that person would be willing to use an extra set of hands, too. The parish needs a few people to take care of **snow removal** and **putting ice removal down** on the lot and walks when needed. We are blessed with an energetic couple who do a great job keeping our church plant clean; but there are always areas that need more attention than their hourly time allows. Do you like cleaning? Sign up and our church cleaners can use your help. Maybe your skills and talents are in **helping with projects**; St. Andrew always has a lot of projects underway that needs leadership. For example, in the past we have sealed and coated the bricks, added gutters, renovated the bathrooms, tinted the big windows in church, changed out the upholstery that was bad in church, to name a few. More projects will be coming; would you like to assist in leading them and bringing them to fruition? These volunteers will need to have the gifts of collaboration, allowing other ideas to be respected and often times implemented and not be focused on getting it done by oneself and doing it his/her way. Another area under administration is volunteering to **assist the parish secretary with office work**. Confidentiality is a must for these volunteers. The type of work needed varies, so it is hard to give a list of possibilities. If you like office work, your skills will be put to good use. Are you interested in **technology**? Parish Website, Facebook, Twitter, the electronic monitor in the gathering space, and many other ways to help us communicate through electronic media is a great need we have. Finances is another area under the administration commission. Parish Council assists me in prioritizing and naming what needs to happen in the parish. They are the vision keepers. Administration/finance helps secure the funds for these items. At St. Andrew, the mission leads and money follows; money does not drive the mission. We have and need more competent people with **budget and finance, fundraising, stewardship and marketing** skills to assist us in this area of administration. *Other areas in this arena, but do not fall under administration commission* include helping with the cemetery. Cemetery has its own board, but is always looking for new ideas, so sign up under **Cemetery Committee** and we will put you in touch with the right people. **Fall Festival** is chaired by 3 parishioners and everyone in the parish is expected to help with it. Knights of Columbus rely on the assistance of many parishioners to make the **fish fries** fun successful events. If you haven't helped before and are interested, mark it on your time and talent form. If you've been helping, you will be asked again. If you want to help oversee the entire operation of what falls under administration, then sign up to be on the **administration commission**; we can't let this get too big or we won't get through our meetings, but if you are interested, sign up and someone will visit you. Next week, I will write about our Education Commission. At this time, I want to say **a special thank you to all who work hard and dedicate themselves making sure all these items happen**; it is my hope you will continue and that you will see new faces alongside you after the next Time and Talent forms are finished and everyone has been contacted. **If you have been doing the same ministries for several years, please sign up again on the new Time and Talent, and/or feel free to sign up for new ministries.**
