Pastor's Notes September 29 and 30, 2018

As you are aware, I have written about our 4 commissions over the past 4 weekends. Now that you know the responsibilities of each commission, we will roll out our time and talent forms the weekend of Fall Festival. Within one week, we will mail those not picked up. It is important everyone fill it out and sign up for everything you are interested in doing, even if you have been doing it for years. They are due back to the parish office on November 4. After November 4, we will contact parishioners who have not returned them.

This weekend, I will talk about Time, Talent and Treasure, our response in gratitude for all God has given to us, including our lives. "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God" is Bishop McKnight's episcopal motto and it is deeply rooted and connected in the church's understanding of stewardship. I look forward to his comments about stewardship at Priest's Institute October 1st-5th. Because I will be at Institute that week, there will be no daily mass. Please know of my gratitude for the countless ways you will all pitch in and help that week getting us ready for fall festival, our largest fundraiser of the year.

On the weekend of October 6 and 7, we will have brief beautiful liturgies. The homily will be about the past year at the parish and the upcoming year. The weekend of October 13 and 14, we kick off the Catholic Stewardship Appeal here at St. Andrew. We will be in a particular challenge to meet our goal this year (\$24,000) in that we will also be gearing up for our fundraiser for the kitchen. We can't neglect either, so we need to be praying about how to meet our CSA goal and prepare for our parish fundraiser. Details about both will be forthcoming, but I wanted you to be aware that I am aware and together, we can make it happen. Also, after Masses on the weekend of October 13 and 14, I will be offering the sacrament of the anointing of the sick to anyone who believes they are sick, or suffers from chronic illnesses or diseases. There will be an insert in an upcoming bulletin.

I will be at a Restorative Justice Seminar in Chicago for prison ministry October 21st-26th. I have not heard who the celebrant for Sunday Mass will be yet. There will not be weekday Mass. We are already praying for the team of women preparing for the upcoming Welcome Weekend October 27th-28th. If you have not already made a weekend, consider making this weekend. It is going to be a good experience, good for you, your family and the parish. Let us pray for our candidates coming to the weekend. While we want to celebrate Halloween with our children and ensure they have a good time, let's not forget it is a Catholic Celebration making fun of Satan who thinks he can scare us; the worst he can do is take our life; which God has trumped by allowing it to be the new birth into eternal life; think about Halloween and how we dress up in a scary costume to try and scare others; but we do it all in fun. This, in reality, shows that while we know Satan tries to scare us, we know who has the final answer and who can trump all of his scare tactics, Jesus Christ. So, the following day, we celebrate November 1, all Saints Day and on November 2, all Souls day. This year we will not have a Mass on Halloween; instead our Masses for the Holy Day of Obligation will be at 8am and 6pm on November 1. And, I encourage everyone to come back the night of November 2. We will have 6pm Mass in church, then candlelit sung procession to the altar in the cemetery for the praying of the rosary immediately following Mass. Remember, October is the month of the rosary, so we all want to take advantage of praying the rosary in the month of October. In November, we remember, especially, those who have died. We will have the book of dead inside the worship space of church to enter our loved one's names.
