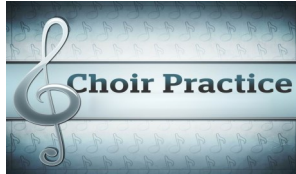

One of the arguments in Roe v Wade court was: "It perhaps is not generally appreciated that the restrictive criminal abortion laws ...are not of ancient or even of common law origin."

This is misleading. Consider the following teachings by early Church Fathers.

The first passage comes from the Didache (Greek for "teaching"), which is usually dated as early as the end of the first century: "...you shall not murder a child by abortion nor kill that which is begotten" (chapter 2). This statement is as clear as it gets.

The second passage is from St. Barnabas from the early second century: "You shall love your neighbour more than your own soul. You shall not slay the child by procuring abortion; nor, again, shall you destroy it after it is born" (Chapter 19).

St. Basil the Great (c.330-379): "Women also who administer drugs to cause abortion, as well as those who take poisons to destroy unborn children, are murderesses" (Letter 188, to Amphilochius concerning the canons, section 8). Notice here how St. Basil is not making any distinctions about what stage in the pregnancy is okay to administer drugs to cause abortion.

Nowhere in these quotes is there a distinction being made between any "stages" of life. For the Fathers, abortion is unequivocal taking of life.

HOUSE PARENTS/RELIEF PARENTS NEEDED

St. Nicholas Academy (SNA), a Federated Agency of Catholic Charities, is a year-round boarding school in Jefferson City that partners with families of lower income to provide quality education for boys.

SNA is seeking a Catholic, married couple to be full time, live-in house parents, as well as a Catholic, married couple to be part-time relief parents.

The main responsibility of house parents is to provide a stable, loving and supportive home environment. Each spouse receives a salary and a compensation package that includes a rent-free apartment, meals, and utilities. House parents are eligible for all of St. Nicholas benefit programs.

The role of relief parents is the care of the students when full-time house parents are away. Relief parents reside in the student home when they are on duty. They receive an hourly wage, all legally mandated benefits and a compensation package that includes a private suite and all meals for the days on duty.
