40 CANS FOR LENT

This Lent, let's help people in our community. It will take less effort than you would expect, but has a big payoff for those in need! The Social Concerns group already has the ball rolling for us and now it is time for everyone else to join in.

All the members of the Knights of Columbus have been challenged to collect a minimum of 40 cans of food per member during Lent. The cans of food can be dropped off in the Gathering Space (the same space food is presently collected). Food collected will be given to the area food pantry.

The Knights are in turn challenging the rest of the parish to join in. The benefit is this, for every 1000 pounds of food collected the Supreme Council (National) Knights of Columbus will refund to us \$100, up to a maximum of \$500 (for 5000 lbs.). Youth Mental Health First Aid Join the Movement

"Today as a Mental Health First Aider, I would recognize that the despondent looking child standing at the edge of the playground or the young person seated over on the side at church, actually might need help. I could be able to summon assistance or simply listen or even wait for professionals to arrive...I could actually save a life..." -Stephanie Thomezeck

Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis. The course introduces common mental health challenges for youth, reviews typical adolescent development, and teaches a 5-step action plan for how to help young people in both crisis and non-crisis situations. Topics covered include anxiety, depression, substance use, disorders in which psychosis may occur, disruptive behavior disorders (including AD/HD), and eating disorders.

Since 2008, more than 550,000 people across the U.S. have been trained in this lifesaving program. Mental Health First Aid training is relevant to everyone. The course gives people the skills to help a family member struggling with addiction, the knowledge to talk to a co-worker suffering from depression, and the confidence to intervene with a friend contemplating suicide. Mental Health First Aid for Youth is being offered through the Anne Marie Project.
