HEALTH CORNER

Did you know that Alzheimer's disease is not a normal part of aging? Everyone experiences forgetfulness with age. But with Alzheimer's disease, these symptoms of memory loss gradually increase and become more persistent.

Alzheimer's disease is a progressive brain disorder that impacts memory, thinking and language skills, and the ability to carry out the simplest tasks. Alzheimer's disease is the most common cause of dementia. Dementia itself is not a disease, but a term used to describe symptoms such as loss of memory, loss of judgment and other intellectual functions. Alzheimer's disease can cause dementia.

Although each individual is unique, experts have identified common warning signs of Alzheimer's disease, including:

~Memory loss, especially of recent events, names, places and other new information

- ~Confusion about time and place
- ~Struggling to complete familiar tasks such as brushing one's teeth
- ~Trouble finding appropriate words, for example in a sentence
- ~Difficulties in judging situations
- ~Changes in mood and personality

If you or a loved one has any of the warning signs, it is best to talk with your primary care provider (doctor, nurse practitioner) to see if further evaluation is necessary.
