Listed below are the requirements necessary for the Sacrament of Confirmation. This applies to all Sacred Heart Parish students including home schooled, PSR students, and day school.

Requirements:

Each student will be required to complete a variety of types of service at each grade level.

6th Grade- 15 hours

7th Grade-15 hours

8th Grade -25 hours

In order to receive credit for completed service hours, the attached reflection form must be submitted as you complete our service projects. Extra forms can be found in the church office, school office, and the back of church. This form should also be signed by whoever oversees organizing or running the volunteer activity. Any unpaid activity deemed appropriate by youth minister, PSR coordinator, school principal, or parish priest will be accepted, except for service for family members. Some examples of acceptable service are listed on the back of this page.

The greatest reward of serving others is how it makes you feel about yourself. That special feeling is God's way of telling you thank you for caring. Thank you for making a difference in the world!
