# Finance Update – 9/15/20

# For August 2020

### **Balance Sheet**

- Cash increased \$27,740 for the month of August to give us a total of \$96,930.
- Cemetery Fund increased \$3,500 from the sale of plots.
- Current Liabilities increased \$22,510 primarily due to the \$17,130 invoice for St. Mary's legal fees from our attorney.

# **Income Statement**

- Revenue for August came in \$13,350 favorable to budget. The largest increases were from envelopes \$6,200 and donations \$6,100. Y-T-D we are \$17,400 favorable to budget.
- Expenses are in control as we are favorable to budget \$6,550 for the month and \$13,670 Y-T-D.

Net Income came in \$19,840 favorable to budget for aAugust. This gives us a favorable Y-T-D variance \$31,280.

# Did you know?

Who invented the cemetery?

**Ancient Cemeteries:** 

The Greeks started burying their dead since at least 3000 BCE. However, history shows that there were burial rituals in Egypt since 6000 BCE!

An organized **cemetery** (the Greeks) was established around 1200 BCE. https://www.ancient.eu/timeline/burial/

The word *cemetery* (from Greek κοιμητήριον, "sleeping place") implies that the land is specifically designated as a burial ground and originally applied to the Roman catacombs. The term *graveyard* is often used interchangeably with cemetery, but a graveyard primarily refers to a burial ground within a churchyard.

LFFC notes 8/31/2020 with updates 9/14

We are on the lookout for new members for LFFC. Liz hopes to encourage parents of younger families to join us.

Strategic Plan objectives on hold while we sort out our approach to the new school year for catechesis. If we go with a family style program in the elementary grades, this will work towards SP objectives to involve families in the catechesis of their children.

We reported that PC is interested in what other parishes are doing for their catechetical situations. Liz is on several calls and meetings and has an idea of what different parishes are doing. The general consensus is that programs will start late out of a desire to not overwhelm parents as school is starting up. Other parishes with schools are mirroring the approach of the public schools; ie: in - person, online and hybrid scenarios. Spirituality is critical at this time. We are committed to doing the safest thing, keeping the message simple.

DMI: . 8 people have been watching the DMI analysis videos. Next steps are to get these people together, have them summarize next steps for us & thank them for their help. Need to see how the DMI and Strategic Plan correspond. Father Chuck is getting up to speed on the DMI

Liz reported on the results of the survey she did of FF families. About 50% responded, which Liz thought was encouraging. Across all grade levels the results were about the same: 60% want in person classes and 40% prefer an online option. The schedule will be:

K4- 5th grade Sunday morning IN PERSON or Monday evening ON ZOOM Middle School and High School IN PERSON and ZOOM options Confirmation prep In PERSON and ZOOM options

Communion / reconciliation prep MOSTLY AT HOME ON OWN SCHEDULE

#### We need to recruit more catechists.

For the elementary program, Liz is considering using a new model being employed in the Archdiocese of Atlanta. The model uses a family meeting structure for the program 3x month. It is project based. Week 1 is the explanation of the family project. Week 2 the family works on the project together (no formal class meeting time). Week 3 the families present their projects. Example: Week 1 The Home is the Domestic Church Week 2: Families make their own altar Week 3: Families explain and present their family altar.

The new school year will launch in October. Registration is open until September 22. Once we see what the registration numbers are for each grade we can make decisions on formats and materials.

Discussion of the new "normal" articles.

Bible Timeline classes began Sept 2 and 3rd

Catholic Comeback officially announced we are in Phase 2. This mostly affects how many people can be at Mass (can be more than 25% if space allows for safe social distancing). The guidelines have not changed for FF.

Liz will ask for help as needed. Holy Spirit to guide us. Impossible situation, there will be failure, but that is part of the process!

# **Strategic Plan Summary Document 9/2020**

# **Leading and Organizing the Vision**

Started with 6 Objectives with 3 to 5 action items for each objective. 9 of 18 action items complete. Performance review process for staff has not begun.

- 2 of 4 action items for identifying and training new leaders are complete
- 1 of 3 action items for recruiting and training parishioners to serve on new commissions has been complete

#### **Parish Ministries**

#### **Prayer and Worship**

- 6 of 7 action items for Develop Strategies for Evangelization and the Sunday Mass. To be completed. The last item was increase youth involvement. There was a Youth Mass in January. Not sure if that was successful
- An action item for the use of music that is more engaging for youth and young adults was also touched by the Youth Mass. Again, not sure of the success

#### LLFF

There were 9 objectives as LLFF was divided into Christian Formation, Youth Ministry, and Adult Formation. Christian Formation:

- 1 of 2 action items were completed for the Objective to increase opportunities for parents to participate.
- 2 of 3 action items completed for Develop a Christian Formation marketing program
- Feedback from parents is shown as ongoing plan for growth and enhancement of Christian Formation

### Youth Ministry:

- 1 of 3 action items completed for Identify methods and components which will engage youth more effectively
- 1 of 2 action items completed for Form a network of young adult volunteers to assist with youth ministry.
- 3 of 3 action items completed for Establish more Youth Ministry Activities

#### **Adult Formation**

- 3 of 4 action items completed for develop a ministry to the young adult population.
   Need to form a core team
- 2 of 3 action items completed for establishing a core team of adult leaders to strengthen and expand faith formation opportunities for adults in the parish. Need to develop roles and a training program for core team leaders.
- 1 of 3 action items completed for establishing an evangelization committee

#### **Human Concerns**

- 3 objectives for this commission. Objective 1 with 4 action items is completed
- Objective 2 on outreach has 1 of 2 objectives complete.
- Objective 3 was dependent on young adult volunteers

### Stewardship

• 4 objectives. Most are complete. The one still in process is Provide a process for parishioners to discern their gifts and talents and to use these talents to service other.

#### **Parish Administration**

#### Finance

• There were 3 objectives. The 1 still needing attention is Work with Stewardship to develop a program of planned giving and estate planning.

#### **Facilities**

• There were 3 objectives. The 1 still needing attention is Assess the technology use and needs of the Parish, then develop a strategy for the ongoing replacement of equipment and the development of technology usage.

### DMI

- To start off, we were to look at the data to find things we do well and challenges. 36% of those who took the survey felt strongly that we make information easy to find. We did well on being welcoming also.
- One challenge is we have 37% taking the survey would be in what we would consider our detractor group....neither agree or disagree, or disagree or strongly disagree with: Parish helps me grow spiritually.
