Did you know?

What is/was the first chartered burial ground in the USA?

Grove Street Cemetery (New Haven, CT). This cemetery is widely recognized as the first chartered burial ground in the U.S.

There was a previous common burial site, called the **New Haven Green**. After yellow fever epidemics in 1794 and 1795, New Haven Green, which held as many as 5,000 burials, was too crowded to continue as the main burial ground.

BUT-

What is the <u>oldest</u> burial ground in the USA?

The Myles Standish Burial Ground

According to the American Cemetery Association, the Myles Standish Burial Ground is the oldest maintained cemetery in the United States. The cemetery is located in Duxbury, Massachusetts and was in use from 1638 – 1789.

What is "Chartered status"? It is a symbol of technical competence and signifies a public commitment to professional standards.

Oldest Graves in the QOA Graveyards (reported in July):

- St. Peter and Paul Margretha Farber, death date 7-28-1859
- St Mary's Peffer Infant, death date 1853.

These two people may have been buried first on a family farm, and then they were moved to the cemeteries after they were established.

Bob also says that the first grave in St. Mary's was for Katie Mackin, death date 1873. He commented that "this seems like quite a bit of time after the land was being used for services".

There is no official information on the date of establishment for either cemetery.

LFFC Update October 2020

- Welcomed new Commission member Tammy Groszczyk.
- A job description for the new DFF (Liz Kuhn) needs to be developed
- -Religious Education calendar and registration are complete. A parent/youth meeting was done in September through a recorded video on QOA's YouTube channel. Sessions (other than Sacrament preparation) began on October 4/5.
- Religious Education Attendance. See chart. 107 children total, 68% of last year

66 families total, 79% of last year

A group of families, most not in a Sacrament year, are taking a pause and plan on returning next yr. 23 families did not respond at all. Mostly in grades K4-8, over half in Grade 3 Curriculum is being developed.

- Catechists and Small Group Leaders are still needed. Could use 2 small group leaders for grades K4-5 Zoom on Monday evenings. Looking to ask last year's Confirmation students to help.
- Confirmation. First session was a group service project to MBHS on October 11.
- RCIA Two adult candidates. One doing self-study. Other is in the process of formation sessions.
- Baptism Preparation. Needs new team members. Current team member is moving out of the parish.
- FOCCUS Pre-Marriage Inventory. Looking for other couples to assist with this, in addition to the Kempkas.
- -Adult Bible Study. Resumed in-person sessions on September 2/3. Continues until December 16/17
- Strategic Plan Discussions on hold as we get the school year started. Some items might need to be reconsidered. Liz met with Christy and Mike S about the Strategic Plan in light of the DMI.
- Disciple Maker's Index (DMI). Father Chuck is contemplating having the 8 parish leaders who watched the webinars together to summarize the learnings. May have another Leadership Summit to communicate and refine the learnings. After that, another group needs to be convened to set priorities/goals/action plans.
- Fundraiser at Bubbas. \$785 raised in September. Will schedule again.
- Winter Drive for MacCanon Brown Homeless Sanctuary continues through October. Mercy Mats resumed on September 19.

Discussion of Article: What is Parish Ministry Never Returns to Normal? Basis of Stewardship talk Stephanie gave at masses the weekend of 10/17-18. We can reset our approach to ministry by asking "What is God doing in my life now and in the lives of families that comprise the parish?" Reset the domestic Church, persons before programs, move away from mechanical ministry models, invest in relationships-new insights, new, creative ways of reaching out. Be open to constant renewal.
