WHAT HAPPENS NOW?

For adults who come into the community of the Church at Easter, the weeks and months following can be a time of wondering and seeking. "Is that all there is?" as the old Peggy Lee song asked. Where do I go from here?

For some old timers, if the looks on their faces are any indication, any positive answers from them may seem deceptive because they seem to have settled into a stagnant faith-life often based on someone else's (usually an elder, a teacher, a "religious" person) fearful sense of the Almighty.

Somehow these super somber folk just didn't absorb the "Good News" (the Gospel) and the message of "Do not be afraid." They seem to be overly cautious if not downright scrupulous. There is little indication of living life "abundantly" as Jesus promised. (John 10:10)

So what's a newcomer (or an oldcomer stuck in Spiritless activities) to do? Find a faith community or group that invigorates you! Get involved; ask questions; take quiet time to <u>listen</u> prayerfully; find and see the beauty in life that is often taken for granted; read Pope Francis' Instruction "Rejoice and Be Glad" (Gaudete et Exsultate).

If you make yourself available, you will be surprised what you may discover. That means living differently by breaking away from the pressure to be always on social media, listening to talk radio/TV, and trying to be part of what others say you "should do." Be your prayerfully reflective self and I suspect you will discover that is exactly the place where you will meet the Creator as you partake in a life you experience but do not control.

"Enjoy the moment." At times, deep personal joy may seem to be beyond our human ability to create. Nonetheless, when you find companions who also discover newness of life on a daily basis, you may well find yourself actively participating in the community you have joined called Church. Keep healthy spiritually and what happens now will be amazing!
