## **Spiritual Pruning**

Now that we can actually see evidence of spring, our thoughts turn to outdoor activities: picnic, parties, sporting events, golf, vacations, or stay-cations. It's nice to get outside and do

something. For most of us that outside activity is taking care of the lawn, garden, trees, and shrubs. With all the techno-toys at our disposal, the number one hobby in this country is still gardening, in some fashion. So, as we are out cutting, trimming, weeding, plucking, and pruning, maybe we could think about the readings for this Sunday.

Jesus tells his followers that he is the **vine** and we are the **branches**. He asks them to remain in his love, and, if they do, they are charged with the task of bearing fruit. Not remaining in Christ's love means we have pruned ourselves away from the vine, away from the love of Christ. It's a good analogy. In our haste to clean up after the long winter, we want the yard to look nice. But a haphazard gardening technique can sever the growth, the stem or blossom that produces the beauty and fruit later in the season.

Sometimes we are quick to put on a good face, of showing others that we are good people by what we do, that we prune away the source of that goodness the love of Christ—just to make a pretty showing. And it's not just ourselves that we prune. In the Acts of the Apostles' reading for today, Saul (Paul) was trying to join the other Apostles but that would have none of him. Paul had a reputation, and even long after the wonderful conversion events or witnessing Jesus' postresurrection appearance, of being able to cure and cast our demons in the name of Jesus, or speaking in tongues and proclaiming the good news to all the nations, still, after all the years had passed even the Apostles couldn't believe that a man-Paul-could have had a personal relationship with Jesus, repented, converted, was baptized, and now wanted to share in spreading the good news. He was, pruned from the believing community.

We have to be careful when we wield the sickle and scythe in our spiritual life. We must watch for the things that truly need to be removed, the things that are detrimental to our spiritual growth, the things that will not allow us to bear fruit in Christ. We must also be careful not to remove what God has placed before us to help us mature and produce the fruit that continues to feed the world with the Word and life of Christ. The Jesuit mantra of "Go, set the world on fire," is not a call to burn the branches of the vine, but to inflame the love of Christ in every heart.

If you find interest and favor with this spiritual pruning analogy, then you're bound to have an equal experience in considering pesticides and herbicides in our spiritual life! ©
