## INWARD REFLECTION

## Tis the month of Mary, Our Mother

Finally, spring has arrived as we begin the month of May, traditionally dedicated to Mary, our Mother. From my youth, it was also the time for May crowning which always seemed to be a part of our First Communion celebrations. The origins of May Crowning are hard to pinpoint, although special devotion to Mary began in the earliest days of the church. Toward the end of the 18th century, Father Latomia, a Jesuit of the Roman College of the Society of Jesus instituted the practice of dedicating the month of May to our Blessed Mother. His desire was to promote devotion to Mary among the students as a way to counteract infidelity and immorality.

From Rome, the May devotion spread throughout the Jesuit colleges, and eventually throughout the whole church. May seemed the most appropriate month because the liturgical calendar marks several feasts honoring Mary: Our Lady, Queen of Apostles (May 5); Our Lady of the Most Blessed Sacrament (May 13); Our Lady of Fatima (May 13); Mary, Help of Christians (May 24); Mary, Mediatrix of All Graces (May 31); and the Visitiation (May 31). In this country, we also honor mothers on the second Sunday of May: Mothers' Day.

The public practice of crowning an image of Mary gained popularity in the 19th century. In Rome, an image of our Blessed Mother holding the Child Jesus is enshrined at the Basilica of St. Mary Major. Tradition holds that St. Luke painted the image. On Aug. 15, 1838, the Feast of the Assumption, Pope Gregory XVI with great solemnity, crowned the image of the Blessed Mother and the practice became popular, especially during the month of May.

In 1987, to help celebrate the Marian Year declared by Pope St. John Paul II, a ritual Order of Crowning an Image of the Blessed Virgin Mary captured the significance of this pious practice. The queen symbol was attributed to Mary because she was a perfect follower of Christ, who is the absolute 'crown' of creation. She is the Mother of the Son of God, who is the messianic King and the maid of Nazareth who consented to God's plan. She journeyed on the pilgrimage of faith, listened to God's Word and kept it in her heart. She remained steadfastly in close union with her Son, all the way to the foot of the Cross.

Thus, in an eminent way, Mary won the 'crown of righteousness,' 'the crown of life,' and the 'the crown of glory' that is promised to those who follow Christ. It seems very appropriate to honor Mary in a special way at St. Xavier Church as well. You will notice the statue of Mary (on the north side Blessed Virgin Mary altar) is crowned with a laurel of flowers. During the month of May, let us be sure to honor our Blessed Mother in our hearts and our homes. Having our own May Crowning is a wonderful way not only to foster devotion and faith, but also to draw us closer to the heart of Our Savior.

Financial Note: With the new tax law almost doubling the standard deduction, many parishioners who previously deducted their charitable giving to St X may no longer find it advantageous to do so. If you are over age 70.5 and required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. This gift would count as a part of your required distribution, yet would not count as income to you, so effectively giving you a deduction you might not otherwise get. Consult your tax advisor for a detailed explanation.
