What Verb Are You?

When I was in grade school, I remember learning about the various parts of a sentence. At first it was easy: noun and verb. Then it seemed someone invented a name for every part, grouping, and phrase of a sentence. Worse yet, we had to diagram them on the chalkboard. (Historical fact: that was a big piece of slate upon which one would scratch words and symbols with a compressed stick of calcium. Yep, not unlike cave drawings.)

Now nouns were easy: a person, place or thing. Verbs were a little trickier. They were introduced to us as "action" words. Running, jumping, driving were all action words. That seemed easy enough to identify. I thought if it ended in -ing, I was good. Not so fast mister! Such words, I found out, also included "is," "being," and "thought" to name but a few. Why, there's no "action" in those words I told myself.

Our Gospel readings of the last few weeks have had a lot of action in them. The main verb has been "Go!" "Go into the world," from two Sundays ago, "I send you" from last Sunday's Gospel, and this week, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." It seems rather obvious that Jesus doesn't want us to just sit (which by the way is also a verb) but he wants us to move, to GO out to the world, to teach all nations. It's a little like a "bait and switch" operation, this little ploy of Jesus.

We are first called to Jesus, to follow him, to understand his message of love and concern for others. Then he introduces us to the Father who is God and Creator of all. And just when we have grasped the need for a relationship with Father and Son, Jesus tells us, "Go." "Go into the world, spread the good news who have seen, heard, and experienced. Make disciples of all nations. Receive the Holy Spirit, forgive others, baptizing them in the name of the Most Holy Trinity." We have been duped. We thought just sitting in relationship with Jesus was all the action that would be required. Instead, he commands us to "Go."

Ah, the mystery of God! How wonderful it is to be chosen to be in an intimate bond with Jesus, who reveals to us the Father's love, and continues to reveal it through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our lives. The Trinity is the very definition of a verb. The Trinity was, is, and ever shall be. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, create, redeem, and sanctify. They give us life, call us into being, send us forth to continue and participate in God's creative action, and welcome us home after life's journey. They invite us to act, to move, to heal, to love, to do everything but "sit" idly by, to "lie" in complacency, or to "wallow" in our own self-absorption. Those words are verbs too, just not the verbs of the Trinity. So, a question for reflection on this Trinitarian feast: What verb are you?

Financial Note: With the new tax law almost doubling the standard deduction, many parishioners who previously deducted their charitable giving to St X may no longer find it advantageous to do so. If you are over age 70.5 and required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. This gift would count as a part of your required distribution, yet would not count as income to you, so effectively giving you a deduction you might not otherwise get. Consult your tax advisor for a detailed explanation.

On the Cover

The image on the cover of today's bulletin is a reproduction of a very famous Russian icon. "The Hospitality of Abraham" was created by Andrei Rublev in the 15th century. The Trinity depicts the three angels who visited Abraham at the Oak of Mamre (Genesis 18), but the painting is full of symbolism and is interpreted as an icon of the Holy Trinity. At the time of Rublev, the Holy Trinity was the embodiment of spiritual unity, peace, harmony, mutual love and humility. The left angel symbolizes God the Father. He blesses the cup, yet his hand is painted in a distance, as if he passes the cup to the central angel, Jesus Christ. The nature of the three persons is revealed through their symbolic attributes, i.e. the house (Father), the tree (Son), and the mountain (Holy Spirit).
