Pastoral Notes: from Fr. Fairbanks

Last weekend, Deacon Tim Crooker and I joined with two dozen other Jesuits and lay people who represent twenty parishes and retreat houses in the Upper Midwest USA province (UMI). This 2-day "communal discernment" conference was conducted by the UMI province leadership and held at the newly renovated Jesuit Retreat House in Parma, Ohio. Our group meets annually, and so this year's conference centered on the topic of future province planning in light of diminished numbers of Jesuits over the years. For example: at present, we have 556 men in the UMI Jesuit province. In thirty years, it is projected our province will be 330 men. So, our discussions and prayer will help the province staff and the Provincial to make critical decisions for missioning these men to various works in the coming decades. While some of our works "desire" that Jesuits be assigned to them (schools and retreat houses), other works such as a parish "require" that Jesuits be assigned there. One aspect of our Ignatian Spirituality is the practice of communal discernment, and this conference provided a time and place for that discernment to continue. In coming months, the UMI Province leadership will do the same with other sectors such as higher education, secondary schools, and international works.

It occurs to me from the above paragraph that many may not understand what I mean by "province." In terms of Jesuit governance, the world is divided into 100 administrative districts or "provinces." Each is



headed by a provincial. Ten years ago, the USA had 10 provinces. Today we have five. In June of 2017, the upper Midwest states joined to create our

"Midwest Province" (UMI) see map above. The other four USA provinces are Northeast (UNE), Central Southern (UCS), Maryland (MAR), and West (UWE).

This Jesuit communal discernment happens also on the local level. A few weeks ago. I invited several parishioners to join in a "Parish Examen", which included some listening sessions around the question: "How are we doing as a Jesuit parish?" or "How Ignatian are we?" Again, the Provincial would like all Jesuit "works" to do such an examen. It is an exercise comparable to how a school or a company constructs a strategic plan. As we draw near to our parish bicentennial (2019), it is good for our parish to examine how well we are serving the local community with our Ignatian Spirituality and the service of faith and justice, and to do better where needed.
