The End Times

I have never been comfortable with confrontation. I always want everyone to get along and live in peace. When my children ask for gift ideas for me, I always tell them that I want a day of peace. It exasperates them but as I have gotten older, "stuff" means less and less. Love and peace within my family and within my "world" is essential to my happiness. I know I am not alone in this desire for harmony. And I know that this is what our loving God wants for each of us.

But finding peace in our current world is a struggle. I anticipate our next family holiday celebration with some amount of dread because there are so many differences of opinion on politics and world events. We tolerate little civility and a lot of raised voices. Not an atmosphere that is conducive for good digestion.

In these weeks before the season of Advent, our Gospel readings concern what we know as "the end times" - the event when the final judgment comes to all mankind. As our modern world becomes more centered on secular concerns and less on spiritual awareness, many wonder if we are in the midst of the end of times.

Passages from scripture during November seem to point to the kind of evil and destruction of the end of time, not unlike many of the tragedies that we see every day. Often, it is hard to hold onto the promises of our Savior. He has promised us all an abundance of grace and blessings. He has saved us and given us the path to eternal life. Jesus is always trustworthy, so why does fear loom so large and care so hard to trust? Why can't we believe in Him?

I think we get so burdened with the world of today that we become blinded to His truth. We need to embrace a true conversion of our hearts: to confess our sins, perform penance, receive Jesus Christ with a clean heart and pray. We are to be the light of Christ to others. So that when they see our light, they will be drawn towards us so that their hearts might be converted too.

The Holy Spirit is so powerful in the heart of a faithful Christian, that trust is quite irresistible. There is no need to debate or fight, for the Holy Spirit gives us all we need.

If we live our lives fully prepared for the "end times", we have no need to fear the dire prophesies about what is to come. The end times may indeed be here, but every one of us is to live our days with our lamps burning. If we're actually living that way, we'll be ready for the end times, whenever they might occur.

Financial Note: With the new tax law almost doubling the standard deduction, many parishioners who previously deducted their charitable giving to St X may no longer find it advantageous to do so. If you are over age 70.5 and are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. This gift would count as a part of your required distribution, yet would not count as income to you, so effectively giving you a deduction you might not otherwise get. Consult your tax advisor for a detailed explanation.




