St. Francis Xavier, pray for us.

Tomorrow (Monday December 3) is the Feast of St. Francis Xavier, the patron of our parish, and the patron saint of missions. As you stand and gaze at the large murals behind the main altar, you can see St. Francis Xavier dressed in white, raising a Cross as he blesses the faithful around him. The ten Jesuits pictured on this right mural are all missionaries who had been sent by St. Ignatius Loyola (in the left mural) to the far reaches of Asia, Britain, and North and South America, Ignatius and many of his companions remained in continental Europe while dedicated missionaries carried the Good News abroad.

In 1821, with the founding of the Diocese of Cincinnati, the new Bishop Edward Fenwick built a small wooden cathedral on the site of our north parking lot. It was then dedicated to St. Peter. Three years later, the bishop built a larger brick cathedral on the site where our church now stands. The small wooden structure then became his new seminary, and in 1829 it was rededicated to St Francis Xavier. This was eleven years before the Jesuits arrived! Two years later, the small diocesan seminary was called "The Athenaeum" and began classes in October 1831.

Here is how Gilbert Garraghan reports it in his history of the Jesuits in the U.S.: "Admiration for the missionary zeal of St Francis Xavier was more than once expressed by Bishop Fenwick and it was no doubt his desire to leave to the future priests of his diocese the inspiration of the saint's memory and example that led him to dedicate his seminary to the great apostle of the Indies."

Later, when Fenwick constructed and moved to a newer cathedral on Plum Street, the Sycamore church retained the name St. Francis Xavier. The Athenaeum became St Xavier College (a mix of prep school and higher studies). Xavier University split off in 1920 and St X High School moved north in 1960. Next year, we celebrate the 200th anniversary of the founding of Catholics in Cincinnati, and the founding of this parish community. Part of our bicentennial celebration will be to publish small items of history like this, and much more. Parishioners will receive a mailing this week with more information about next year's events.

Many of you recall Fr. Michael Sparough, S.J. who served at St X about 20 years ago. He now works with Heart to Heart Ministries and has generously offered us copies of their new book of meditations for Advent and Christmas: "Ornaments of Grace." An "ornament" is a short biographical sketch of someone living out God's word. Fr. Michael also offers a daily video series for each day of Advent. The booklets are in the back of church, and the daily video meditations are found at www.heartoheart.org/ornaments (note: only 2 t's)

Financial Note: With the new tax law almost doubling the standard deduction, many parishioners who previously deducted their charitable giving to St X may no longer find it advantageous to do so. If you are over age 70.5 and are required to take a distribution from your IRA, you can circumvent the tax law change and still, in effect, deduct your charitable gifts to St. X by giving to St X directly from your IRA. This gift would count as a part of your required distribution, yet would not count as income to you, so effectively giving you a deduction you might not otherwise get. Consult your tax advisor for a detailed explanation.




